### Narrative:

03MAY93

I contacted DET. Norby of the Rio Rancho (NM) Police department asking him to arrest Father MacRae. I had already faxed him materials on MacRae in case he consented to an interview. I also faxed a copy of the warrant and complaint.

2345HRS

I was notified at home that MacRae was in custody.

04MAY93

0930HRS

I received a call from Norby who spoke with MacRae. he stated that MacRae was not home all day, that a patrol unit saw him at around 2100HRS and arrested him then. Norby spoke with MacRae who was shown the warrant. MacRae knew the victim, referred to as [REDACTED], as [REDACTED] and identified him as such to Norby. Norby characterized MacRae as full of indignation for his having been arrested and that he denied everything.

MacRae did state that in 1987 he did proposition a 15 year old boy and that he subsequently confessed to doing this. He also told about driving his car at 60PMH into a parked car in a suicide attempt the next day.

MacRae told Norby that he has temporal lobe epilepsy and is on medication for this condition. MacRae states he was diagnoses in 1989 for this condition by a neurologist.

He also confirmed that he has an 800 number and claims that [REDACTED] has tried to blackmail him through letters and calls. He states he has forwarded these letters to his attorney in New Hampshire who he refused to identify.

MacRae claims to be self-employed working at the Paraclets Center. MacRae was asked what he does and he said he counsels sex offenders.

MacRae will be arraigned today and assigned counsel. It is unknown if he will waive rendition at this time. An investigator, [REDACTED] with the District Attorney office was identified as a contact person for our Sheriff's Office. His telephone number is [REDACTED] I passed this information along to Capt. Fish (CCSD).

## Narrative:

17MAY93

I received a call from a reporter (Steve H) from the Porstmouth Herald regarding a report that MacRae had attempted suicide in New Mexico. This report was confirmed by MacRae's attorney, Ronald Koch.

I called Ronald Koch (505 247-2972) and he confirmed that MacRae had attempted suicide and was sent to the ST Joseph hospital and then transferred to a larger facility, that being The Presbyterian Hospital in Albuquerque. Koch states it is unknown at this time if he has sustained any head injury. He states that his Carbon Monoxide rate is .37 and according to Koch .39 is fatal. However a check with a local pathologist states that .60 is generally considered fatal. Above .20 is pathological and at .40 the person experiences headaches and confusion. I was also told that a smoker can tolerate even higher rates.

I spoke with DET Norby (505 247-2972) and he confirmed that MacRae had tried to commit suicide. He feels it is a legitimate attempt. The garag at his complex are separate from the living spaces. Each person's garag spot is separated by wire mesh. The person next to Macrae's went to get his car and found MacRae slumped over with his truck running and a vacuum hose attached from the tailpipe to the cab. MacRae was unconscious when removed. Two notes were found, one addressed to DET Norby and the other to someone at the Center of the Paraclets. DET Norby told me that neither letter contained a confession. In fact the one to him proclaimed his innocence. Norby will be faxing me a copy of these. The letter to the Church concerned his embarrassing them and asked them to arrange for his funeral.

Norby states that MacRae is being housed for 24 hours in an oxygen enriched chamber. It is unknown if he has any permanent impairment. The last DET Norby heard was that he was responsive but not conscious.

I tried to call [REDACTED] to inform him of this, but he was not home. I also called [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both assigned to this case in Cheshire and Rockingham Counties. I also called the attorney's for all three victims so they could inform their clients.

MacRae's suicide note to DET Norby states:

"5/16/93 Detective Norby, For what it's worth, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have been lying about everything. Ask McLaughlin to press them a little, he'll see. It may be that McLaughlin already knows."

### Narrative:

14MAY93

[REDACTED] before testifying and I met with Assistant County Attorney Robert Gainor. This meeting took place in Gainor's office and [REDACTED] was asked to relate specific information regarding his recall of events that took place in Hampton, New Hampshire. [REDACTED] first spoke about how he was able to fix the date of the incident. He recalled the season (out of school/summer) and related other facts recalled about the drive from Cheshire to Rockingham County. His parents were pending a divorce and the family's friend, Father Gordon Macrae, was turned to by [REDACTED] mother for assistance. Part of this assistance involved Father Macrae taking [REDACTED] on a short trip to Hampton. [REDACTED] would then be afforded the opportunity to be counseled by Father Macrae and would be out of the family setting.

[REDACTED] told how he was with Father Macrae as they traveled to Hampton. He recalled driving past Dublin Lake on Route #101 (major highway for east/west travel in southern New Hampshire). Father Macrae did speak with [REDACTED] about his father leaving the marriage. Once in Hampton they stopped at the Hampton church rectory. [REDACTED] was able to describe the first floor and the rooms later occupied for his overnight stay on the second floor. A maid also worked in the rectory and she served dinner. Both [REDACTED] and Father Macrae were at this dinner and [REDACTED] recalled that they had salmon to eat. Also at this dinner was another catholic priest and another adult male. [REDACTED] is not sure if this man was a priest or not.

After dinner and into the evening, [REDACTED] was on the second floor with Father Macrae. This second floor had a bar where Father Macrae served [REDACTED] alcoholic beverages. [REDACTED] recalls that these were mixed drinks. Father Macrae mixed them and he was given different types of hard liquor. Father Macrae did not have any alcohol to drink, [REDACTED] knew Father Macrae as a recovering alcoholic. [REDACTED] believes he spent about an hour drinking under Father Macrae's supervision and company. [REDACTED] states he became both drunk and nauseous from this drinking. He described how he was dizzy as well. [REDACTED] did not throw up but felt as if he might. This was [REDACTED] first experience with using alcohol.

Father Macrae assisted [REDACTED] in getting into his bed. [REDACTED] was in bed and dressed in only his undershorts. Father Macrae remained clothed. Father Macrae was at [REDACTED] bedside when he started to rub [REDACTED] body and this culminated with his fondling [REDACTED] genitals and then performing fellatio on [REDACTED] person. This act stopped when [REDACTED] ejaculated. [REDACTED] occupied a different bedroom than Father Macrae. After the sex Father Macrae spent the night in his own room.

The next day [redacted] got up and had breakfast with Father Macrae. This simply consisted of their having some juice and a donut at the rectory. They spent the day together in the Hampton area. [redacted] recalled having lunch at a local McDonald's restaurant. After lunch Father Macrae drove to what appeared to [redacted] as a very fancy, large and beautifully landscaped building. This was about a fifteen minute drive along the coast and north on Hampton. [redacted] was instructed to wait outside as Father Macrae went into the building. Father Macrae returned after approximately fifteen minutes. Its unknown to [redacted] as to what took place or the reason for the short visit.

They returned to Hampton and had dinner at a Pizza Hut restaurant which is located across the street from the rectory. The second night also involved time spent with Father Macrae on the second floor of the Hampton rectory. Again Father Macrae served [redacted] alcoholic drinks from the bar. Again [redacted] came under the influence of the drinks he was served by Father Macrae. [redacted] then got dressed for bed, this being in his underwear. He was watching TV (same room as bar) with Father Macrae who started to kiss him and make other sexual advances. These advances included Father Macrae touching his genitals over his clothes. As a result of these advances [redacted] decided to avoid contact with Father Macrae by going to bed.

When [redacted] went to his bed he laid on his stomach so as to protect his genitals from being touched by Father Macrae. Father Macrae came into his room and started to massage his body. [redacted] recalls Macrae as entering the room wearing a T-shirt and a pair of shorts, possibly boxer-type. [redacted] recalled the room as being dark. Father Macrae also tol [redacted] that he wanted him to kiss him better, a reference to lip to lip kissing instead of the kiss to cheek that Father Macrae was performing earlier. [redacted] avoided doing so. Father Macrae removed [redacted] underwear down to his knees. [redacted] bent his knees to resist Father Macrae from removing them all together. Father Macrae continued to massage [redacted] while in a straddled position over his person. From this straddle position Father Macrae continued to massage [redacted] back. Father Macrae then press his penis against [redacted] buttocks. [redacted] further described Father Macrae's penis as going between his buttocks and against his anal opening. [redacted] explained how he constricted his anal opening to thwart attempts by Father Macrae to enter him with his penis. [redacted] states it seemed like Father Macrae was in his room for a long time, but that it was probably for about ten minutes before he left. [redacted] speculates that Father Macrae left because he could detect the resistance shown.

The next morning [redacted] got up and met with Father Macrae. Nothing was said at this point about the activities of the prior night. On the way back to Keene they stopped at the Mall of New Hampshire which is located in Manchester, New Hampshire. Father Macrae bought [redacted] an expensive walkman tape player along with 3/4 tapes. After the purchase and while enroute to Keene Father Macrae asked [redacted] to keep the activities of their weekend between them. Once they arrived at [redacted] home Father Macrae came in with [redacted] and spent a while there before leaving.

[redacted] did not tell anyone about what had happened. He said he tried to put some efforts into forgetting about what had occurred. When he saw

Father Macrae with other boys he would speculate to himself whether they also had the same type of things happening to them that he had experienced. [REDACTED] said at the time he was very confused over the sex [REDACTED] with Father Macrae and questioned why his body would respond and [REDACTED] troubled over his ejaculating and being erect. Due to this confusion [REDACTED] did not tell anyone about this.

On 07/20/93 Detective McLaughlin turned over to this officer a search warrant to be executed. The search warrant was for photographs of the exterior and interior of the Rectory for St Bernard's church located at 173 Main Street in Keene, NH.

I called the rectory and spoke with Father Biron the pastor. I advised Father Biron of the warrant and a time of 1000 AM was set to execute the warrant.

I went to St Bernard's a little before 1000 AM and parked in back of the Rectory. Using the departments Minolta SRT-200 35MM camera loaded with Kodak GC-135 film I first took several shots of the exterior of the Rectory. These photos show the South side of the building, including the entrances. See photographic log for descriptions, camera settings, lens, settings, and distances used.

When these photos were completed I rang the bell at the side entrance. The door was answered by Father Biron, who invited me in. I explained the search warrant to Father Biron and gave him a photo copy of the search warrant signed by Judge Howard Lane.

Using the departments Minolta SRT-200 35MM camera loaded with Kodak GC-135 film photographs were taken starting with the entrance to the Rectory. A Metz 45CT-1 flash powered by a Quantum battery was used for illumination on all interior photographs.

Photos were taken of the first floor offices, dinning room, living

room, and kitchen. Next photos were taken showing the second floor bed rooms and sitting rooms. When that was completed, photographs were taken of the third floor living areas, including several bed rooms and sitting rooms.

Photographs were taken from the window of two bed rooms located on the South side of the third floor. In the view from both these windows, three crosses can be seen on the roof of St Bernard's church next to the Rectory. Two crosses are located on the front of the church building and one in the rear on the peak of the roof.

After photographing was completed on the third floor, we went to the basement. There photographs were taken showing the money room, where the church offerings are counted and bagged.

See photographic log for descriptions, camera settings, lens settings, and distances used.

After leaving the Rectory at approximately 1045 AM, I took the exposed film to Cheshire Color Service for processing. The negatives and prints will be on file and available.

The search warrant was turned over to Detective McLaughlin for return to the Keene District Court.

### Narrative:

1700HRS., INTERVIEW OF [REDACTED]

As arranged [REDACTED] came in for an interview. [REDACTED] had contacted me a week earlier to make this appointment. He wanted to report about his being sexually abused by two priests as arranged by Gordon MacRae. This incident took place in the rectory in Hudson, New Hampshire. I had been in contact with a Hudson detective and C. Divine of the Hillsboro County Attorney's office regarding this case.

[REDACTED] told me of the difficulties he has had in deciding to reveal this incident. We had spoken earlier in November of 1988 and again in November of 1992 (documented). [REDACTED] stated he was able to reveal all of his contacts and activities with MacRae except for what happened in Hudson, New Hampshire. He first revealed this incident to his attorney, George Dickson (Milford), in April of 1993. During the same month he also described this occurrence to his psychologist, Michael Dueframe (sp).

[REDACTED] through his continued contact with both of these men, developed trust and was then able to reveal his most troubling trauma.

[REDACTED] has always had the knowledge of what happened to him in Hudson. This is not a case of repressed memory sparked into consciousness through regressed therapy, hypnosis, or any other modality of psychotherapy. Counseling has caused him to think more clearly of the event. [REDACTED] explained that he has pushed this event far back into his mind because he did not want to deal with it. His counselor has worked with him to deal with this past trauma and as a result he is better able to give a complete account without falling back into his old coping method of just not dealing with the reality of what happened to him.

About three months ago [REDACTED] decided that he would share some of the facts of what happened to him with his mother. He felt that she needed to know in order for her to better understand what he went through and what he is presently dealing with. [REDACTED] elected not to give her a complete account of the specific sexual acts performed. [REDACTED] decided this in order to spare her emotionally. Even with what was revealed, [REDACTED] had a difficult and emotional time when hearing the abridged account.

[REDACTED] states that this incident occurred in 1982, during the spring, on a Saturday, and just before Father MacRae's ordination. [REDACTED] birth is [REDACTED]. This incident occurred before his birthday. This would mean that [REDACTED] was 16 years old at the time. [REDACTED] also places the incident because he was still shaken and upset about what happened to him in Hudson when he learned from his mother that the family would be attending Father

MacRae's ordination. [REDACTED] felt trapped. He did not want to attend and contact with Father MacRae, but at the same time could not come forth a tell his mother what had happened to him. Father MacRae was a close friend of the family at the time (as recorded in other supplements).

[REDACTED] told me that he had made other trips with MacRae which included short stays (not overnight) at the Hudson rectory. MacRae would take him to Benson's (zoo) or they would stop while enroute to visit MacRae's parents in Lowell, Massachusetts. [REDACTED] had stopped at the Hudson rectory with MacRae, without incident, on three to four other occasions.

MacRae arranged with [REDACTED] to make another visit to Hudson. [REDACTED] did not anticipate any problems and in fact looked forward to the trip as he had a strong relationship/friendship with MacRae. MacRae was looked at by [REDACTED] as his surrogate father. [REDACTED] adopted father had just left the home and [REDACTED] found himself in need of adult male contact. MacRae filled this need. MacRae also engaged [REDACTED] in a course of receiving gifts. This included cash, clothing and other gifts, making [REDACTED] feel increasingly indebted to MacRae. (see note #1)

[REDACTED] states how he can recall what the outside and inside of the Hudson rectory looks like but doesn't know how to get to it. When he arrived there with MacRae (afternoon) there were five to six other men there who he assumed were priests. When he got there MacRae sat him down in a room with a TV and gave him a soda. MacRae left telling [REDACTED] that he would be back in five minutes. This incident took place on a Saturday.

When MacRae came back he told [REDACTED] to come with him. [REDACTED] followed MacRae down a hallway. As they walked MacRae told [REDACTED] to "just do as I say". [REDACTED] asked him what he meant and was again told, "just do as I say". He followed MacRae to a first floor bedroom which they entered. MacRae instructed [REDACTED] to take all of his clothes off. [REDACTED] did as MacRae told him. [REDACTED] said he was getting scared and MacRae told him, "just don't ask me questions" and "just do as I say". MacRae also told [REDACTED] that he would have to do as he said or their relationship would be over. [REDACTED] told how he thought about his need to be friends with MacRae and how he felt like he owed him because of all the time spent together and the gifts he had received from him. He used to call him "dad". After [REDACTED] clothes were off, MacRae left the room. [REDACTED] was still scared as he stood naked and alone in this bedroom.

After a few minutes a man who [REDACTED] assumes is a priest entered the bedroom. [REDACTED] who was still naked covered his genitals with his hands. [REDACTED] described this man as being in his 40's or early 50's. He was tall and thin and wore a beard. He was not wearing clothes of a priest. As he entered he asked [REDACTED] how he was doing. He had [REDACTED] sit on the bed and as he sat next to him. [REDACTED] said the man appeared to be trying to comfort him. As he sat next to [REDACTED] he spoke with him. He then began to massage his arms, then his legs and then moved his hands to his genitals. [REDACTED] said he kept his legs together to avoid having his genitals touched. At this point he knew something was going to happen. [REDACTED] said he kept thinking that he owed MacRae and his need for his friendship and how MacRae told him to do as he was told.

his man rolled [REDACTED] over and had him laying face down on the bed.

██████████ could hear the man undo his pants. The man instructed ██████████ to be quiet as he got on top of him and entered his rectum with his penis. ██████████ reported how he had never had this done to him before and he found it extremely painful. ██████████ made noises indicating that he was in pain and started to cry. The man having anal intercourse told ██████████ to be quiet. ██████████ told how he went into shock over what was happening and felt like he was frozen in place. The man eventually got off of him and zipped his pants back up. When he got off, ██████████ said he was still sobbing and he rolled up into a fetal position on the bed. The man then left the room without further comment. ██████████ said he was now bleeding from the rectum, the blood was on the inside of his legs.

As he laid on the bed another man came in who ██████████ also believes is a priest. This man was shorter than the first and had a heavy set build. He looked older than the first probably in his 50's. He was going bald. At first ██████████ felt this man was coming to help and comfort him. The man noticing that ██████████ was sobbing and curled up asked what was wrong. ██████████ told him that he was hurt. The man verbally comforted ██████████ telling him that it was all right and that everything was OK. ██████████ began to believe that his man was only there to comfort him, but he was wrong. This man also rolled him over like the first. He undid his pants and entered ██████████ rectum with his penis and had anal intercourse. This second intercourse was as painful as the first. ██████████ continued to bleed as well. This man eventually got off of ██████████ and pulled his pants up and walked out of the bedroom. He did not say anything as he left the room.

██████████ laid on the bed again in pain and upset over what was happening to him. After laying there for about five minutes Gordon MacRae came in and told him "lets go" and to get dressed, "we're leaving". ██████████ said he was still sobbing, bleeding and in pain. He said it was like MacRae was a different person. After leaving the rectory MacRae took ██████████ out to dinner and to a movie. He never made mention of what happened in the church rectory. ██████████ said MacRae avoided any direct eye contact during the rest of the evening and appeared very nervous to him. ██████████ can not recall the name of the restaurant other to say that it was a nondescript roadside restaurant. He recalled the movie as "Star Trek: Wrath of Khan (see note #2)". ██████████ said that MacRae did not have to tell him not to tell anyone about what happened at the rectory. That MacRae knew he would never be able to tell anyone.

██████████ spoke about the great amount of sexual confusion he had as a result of this incident and others perpetrated by MacRae. He said he was in the midst of his sexual identity development and had a girlfriend at the time who wanted to be sexual with him. These incidents caused him so much confusion that he was unable to be sexual with this female and as a result his relationship broke off.

██████████ never saw these two other men that had sex with him in Hudson again. They could have been at the ordination in Hudson a few weeks later. But there were a lot of priests there and he did not see them. Nor did he make any effort to do so preferring to block out any recall of what happened that Saturday afternoon in Hudson.

██████████ has tried to examine why he went along and did not resist the sex. He feels as if he was totally manipulated by MacRae and that he

was at a particular needy and vulnerable point in his life. MacRae used this to manipulate him and held their relationship as ransom in exchange for his cooperating. [REDACTED] also said his feelings of indebtedness to MacRae as a result of his receiving all the gifts also played into his being victimized. His prior sexual contact with MacRae (documented in other supplements and court papers) also lowered his inhibitions to being involved in homosexual contact. This incident was characterized as his doing a favor for MacRae who he perceived as owing a great debt of gratitude to.

[REDACTED] recalled the first floor bedroom as a small room with a single bed. This bed was position against one of the walls. The walls were white. A bureau with a mirror was against another wall. There was a window. On the wall was a framed picture of Jesus Christ.

#### PREFERENTIAL SEX OFFENDERS

The preferential Child Molester has a definite sexual preference for children. All things being equal, given a choice between a child and an adult sex partner, the Preferential Child Molester would choose the child. This chapter will not attempt to explain why these offenders would choose a child. Whatever the reason, such individuals do exist. Their sexual fantasies and erotic imagery focus on children. They have sex with children, not because of some situational stress or insecurity, but because they are sexually attracted to and prefer children. They can possess a wide variety of character traits, but engage in highly predictable sexual behavior. Although they may be smaller in number than the Situational Child Molester, they each have the potential to molest large numbers of victims. For many of them, their problem is not only the quality of their sex drive (attraction to children), but also the quantity of their sex drive (need for frequent and repeated sex with children). Within this category at least three major patterns of behavior emerge.

#### SEDUCTION

This pattern characterizes the offender who engages children in sexual activity by seducing them. He seduces children the same way that men seduce women and women seduce men--with attention, affection and gifts. He seduces children over a period of time by gradually lowering their sexual inhibitions. Frequently his victims arrive at the point where they are willing to trade sex for attention, affection, and other benefits they receive from the offender. Many of these offenders are simultaneously involved with multiple victims, operating what has come to be called a child sex ring. This may include a group of children in the same class at a school, in the same scout troop, or in the same neighborhood. The characteristic that seems to make this individual the master

seducer of children, is his ability to identify with children. He knows how to talk to children--but more importantly, he knows how to listen to children. His adult status and authority are also an important part of this seduction process. In addition, he frequently selects as targets children who are victims of emotional or physical neglect.

On 07/30/93 this officer and Detective McLaughlin traveled to Hampton to execute a search warrant for photographs of the rectory for Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal church in Hampton, New Hampshire. We arrived at the rectory at approximately 1400 hours where we met with a Hampton officer.

Using the departments Minolta SRT-200 35MM camera loaded with Scotch 100 film, several photos were taken showing the exterior of the rectory and area.

Next a series of photographs were taken showing the interior of the building, starting on the first floor and continuing to the second floor rooms.

The same camera was used this time loaded with Kodak GC-135 film. A Metz 45 CT-1 flash powered by a Quantum battery was used on all interior photographs.

The photographs show the interior starting at the front entrance, left to right through the first floor and then the second floor offices, sitting rooms and bed rooms.

See photographic log for descriptions, camera settings, lens settings, and distances used.

After leaving the rectory we stopped at the Pizza Hut approximately

A source told me that [REDACTED] had contact with Gordon MacRae a few years ago and had been victimized in some way. This information came out during subsequent counseling. No further specifics were known.

I spoke with [REDACTED]'s mother, [REDACTED] and she reported how she had arranged for her son to be counseled by MacRae. This occurred when [REDACTED] was about 16 years old. Some time later [REDACTED] reported to his mother that he was sexually solicited by MacRae and this took place over a three hour period when he was unable to get away from MacRae. [REDACTED] described how difficult this was for [REDACTED] to reveal and he was described as very upset and emotional when he did so. She states that [REDACTED] has never gotten over this. After his contact with Gordon MacRae, [REDACTED] noticed that [REDACTED] increased in his use of alcohol/drugs and started to runaway from home. No further specifics are know about the nature of the sexual solicitation.

[REDACTED] just moved to Wisconsin a few days ago. [REDACTED] will forward his address and telephone number so I can speak with him directly.

[REDACTED] was taken to a location, near Hampton, while spending the weekend with Gordon Macrae. He didn't know the name of this place/building but knew it was in a town close to Hampton. While watching the news he saw the building that he visited. This being St. Francis' in Rye, New Hampshire. The building is scheduled to be closed by the catholic church.

I called the Rye Police and asked them about the building. They said it is owned and operated by the catholic church. That it used to be used for retreats and then for AA meetings and such. I asked them to take some pictures of the building for this investigation.

I called Derby Lodge (869-2210) and spoke with one of their directors with the first name of Cathy. I told her who I was and that I was looking to identify a former staff member who worked there in 1984 with the first name of Debbie. Cathy knew who I was speaking about and said that releasing her full name posed a dilemma since she had been dismissed under bad terms and she felt as if she needed to talk to other staff members before releasing her full name. Cathy then asked which patient Debbie had contact with. I told Cathy that I could not release his name at this point without talking to my attorney and would have to get back to her with an answer. We arranged to speak again in the afternoon.

I spoke with [REDACTED] and told her that I was trying to establish a list of witnesses that would have seen [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] in MacRae's presence. She said there were numerous persons who had done so. She mentioned [REDACTED] as a person who seen the boys and who seen them in the rectory with MacRae. [REDACTED] told me that in 1987 she went with Laffond to the lower Main Street ST Joseph's cemetery to look at a plot for her mother who had just died. [REDACTED] started to speak about MacRae and made mentioned that her boys spend a lot of time with him but that they are all smart and she shouldn't worry about them. Looking back [REDACTED] feels as if [REDACTED] was warning her about MacRae but she was to upset about the death of her mother to fully understand.

I told [REDACTED] that MacRae testified that he never counseled [REDACTED]. She couldn't believe this and said he certainly did and on a number of different occasions. She stated that [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] had attended a counseling session with [REDACTED] and MacRae had told her that she should get an abortion. [REDACTED] was very upset and her parents as well as [REDACTED] met and discussed what to do and further discussed MacRae's opinion about [REDACTED] getting an abortion.

[REDACTED] was also told that MacRae states that no one under age 18 is allowed above the first floor and that he stated that he did not have any of the boys stay the night in the rectory. [REDACTED] states that [REDACTED] stayed there numerous times and that MacRae would call her to let her know where he was. This bothered [REDACTED] and she used to tell MacRae that she wanted [REDACTED] home, she feared [REDACTED] was using MacRae so he could stay out late at night. She also recalled that in 1983 that [REDACTED] stayed there for a weekend and that MacRae had been told that [REDACTED] was acting strange. This behavior included his staying in his room listening to music and a general withdrawal. [REDACTED] contributed this to the separation

of her husband from the family. She spoke with MacRae about this and he offered to take [REDACTED] for a few days and kept him at the rectory overnight. When he brought [REDACTED] back he sat [REDACTED] down and told her that he wouldn't like what he had to tell her. MacRae then told [REDACTED] that she thought that [REDACTED] might be gay. 8837

[REDACTED] states that there are a number of people that could dispute the lies that MacRae testified to under oath. She also mentioned that MacRae stated in an interrogatory that he has trouble with his memory. I told [REDACTED] that MacRae testified that he has no problems with his memories.

[REDACTED] also mentioned that Father Horne saw the boys with MacRae and warned her against him. She felt at the time that Father Horne was having a personality conflict with MacRae. I asked about Father Quinn and she stated that he is now a monsignor and possibly still in the Manchester Diocese.

1405HRS

I spoke with Frederick Laffond of 15 Riverton Street, Keene. Laffond works at ST Bernards church. Laffond was asked about MacRae. Laffond stated that Macrae was at the church for a short time and he never "connected" with him. During MacRae's tenure at the church, Laffond feels he might have had about two hours of total contact.

I asked Laffond about his 1987 conversation with [REDACTED]. He has known [REDACTED] for years and they went through high school together. He recalls being with her but not about the conversation he had with her. He said it is possible.

Laffond has two sons and they also had the same opinion about MacRae they felt he was different and stayed clear of him.

Laffond said he received a questioner from MacRae's lawyer and a follow up letter saying that it needed to be returned or that they would subpoena him. Laffond states he has a hard time thinking back and has had a hard time with the questions. He was asked about other priests including Father Scruton. He was also asked about the views from the different rooms in the rectory. In order to answer these questions he had to visit the rooms because his job does not require him to be above the first floor. In fact he has never been to the third floor and only has been on the second a couple of times.

[REDACTED] returned my call and identified the worker at Derby Lodge with the first name of [REDACTED] as [REDACTED]

07DEC93

0815HRS

I spoke with [REDACTED] and asked that he write down some specifics about the four incidents of counseling which resulted in MacRae performing fellatio on his person. I explained to him that we wanted

to be able to give the defendant this information so he could differentiate between the different counts of the indictment. I also asked him to write down some specifics about incidents of fellatio that occurred in counseling sessions after age 16 but prior to age 18. Thomas started to give me some specifics but I told him to write this down and I would get back in touch at the end of the week.

I told [redacted] that MacRae testified that he never counseled him. [redacted] couldn't believe that he would make such a lie on the stand. He offered that [redacted] who was a past girlfriend had attended one of the counseling sessions.

I told [redacted] that MacRae also testified that persons under the age of 18 were not allowed past the first floor. [redacted] offered [redacted] and [redacted] as two subjects who have been on the second floor. [redacted] and Tom helped Macrae move into the rectory and also assisted a priest from the sea coast move into the rectory. This priest had a drinking problem and had to be moved out of his assigned parish and into the Keene rectory. [redacted] is presently living in Georgia.

1300HRS

I spoke with [redacted] and asked him to think about the two incidents of fellatio by MacRae which took place in the rectory during the summer of 1983 [redacted]. I asked him to give this some thought and that we wanted to give the defense specifics about these two incidents so they can be differentiated.

I asked [redacted] about who might have seen him stay the night in the rectory. [redacted] stated that Father Scruton was a witness to his having stayed the night. I asked about Freddie Laffond and [redacted] said he was around during the day but not at night. [redacted] mentioned that a cook would see him in the morning. He does not recall her name but stated that she was elderly at the time.

In the later 80's while [redacted] was in high school he would stop by the rectory at night and noted that [redacted] was staying the night on numerous occasions with MacRae.

[redacted] acknowledged that MacRae did live at first on the second floor and then moved to the third. [redacted] also stated that Macrae did have an office on the first floor, or at least an office he claimed to be his own.

[redacted] called because he recalled that when he was a juvenile he was sent to court because of a shoplifting incident. Gordon Macrae came to court with him and part of [redacted] court disposition was court ordered counseling by MacRae. [redacted] stated that Capt. Walker of the Keene Police Department was there as was Judge Talbott.

I received a call from [REDACTED]. I asked her about her son ever staying the night or being on the second or third floor of the rectory. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] was in the upstairs of the rectory a couple of times that she knows of and probably a number of times that she doesn't. She specifically remembered one time when she had been in Connecticut for the day visiting her mother. When she returned to Keene she went straight to the rectory, she is not sure why she did so. She used to go to the rectory at least once a week as a part of prayer meeting with other women in the church. Two other members of this prayer group worked at the rectory. One lived there and the other used to clean the rectory. When she got to the rectory she was speaking with these women in the kitchen when they asked if she knew that her son [REDACTED] was upstairs. They asked [REDACTED] if anyone had called her. They informed her that [REDACTED] was sick and had to leave school and was now with MacRae upstairs. [REDACTED] explained that [REDACTED] needed to have an adult take him from school and since she was out of state for the day that [REDACTED] had called MacRae who then responded to the school and checked him out. [REDACTED] asked the women if she could go upstairs and they said she could. She then went to the second floor and knocked on the door. MacRae answered the door and let her into a living room where [REDACTED] was laying down on a couch. [REDACTED] states she recalled [REDACTED] face as showing a great deal of relief when seeing her and he asked her to take him home. [REDACTED] added that [REDACTED] had been up to Macrae's living space before this incident as well.

[REDACTED] is attending UMASS this semester and will be home for the holidays. I asked [REDACTED] to tell [REDACTED] that I am still interested in speaking with him if possible. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] does everything he can to avoid talking about Macrae and she has been trying to get him into counseling.

09DEC93

I spoke with Captain Walker and recalls that Gordon Macrae was involved with the [REDACTED] family and specifically with [REDACTED] when he went to juvenile court. Gordon Macrae was involved in counseling [REDACTED]

I checked with the court records and found the following:

1. That Gordon MacRae signed a document as a witness to the hearing on 8/4/86 and references to [REDACTED] going to Derby Lodge.
2. A social investigation by probation officer Sherwood Vacchs states, "...counseling in past with Dr. Rossach and with Father Macrae at ST Bernards...."
3. A letter from Father Gordon Macrae on ST Bernard stationary to the court with the first sentence being, "I have known the above named juvenile as a family friend and counselor for the past seven years."

I asked the court clerk to keep these records for further review and so that certified copies can be made.

ODEC93

[REDACTED] s arranged [REDACTED] came to the Keene Police department for an interview. I spoke with [REDACTED] in the Investigation Division's interview room. This interview went uninterrupted and lasted for approximately one hour.

I spent some time talking with [REDACTED] about his present situation. He is recently engaged to be married and presently lives with his girlfriend in [REDACTED]. His girlfriend is attending college in [REDACTED] to become an elementary school teacher. [REDACTED] works in a hotel. They came back to Keene for the holidays. [REDACTED] grew up as a Lutheran. His mother, [REDACTED], worked as a secretary at the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at the time of this incident.

[REDACTED] told me that he had a troubled adolescence which culminated with his running away to California where he stayed for approximately one year. He then came back to Keene and was still having trouble getting along with his parents. His mother had met Father Macrae through her employment and suggested that [REDACTED] see him for counseling. She told [REDACTED] that Macrae was a good guy and he would like him. [REDACTED] met Father Macrae briefly when he was at his house one day. Subsequently he met Father Macrae at his mother's work place and started to speak with him. He had a good impression from this encounter and arrangements were made for him to meet with Father Macrae at the rectory. [REDACTED] explained that he had a substance abuse problem and this was the reason for his needing counseling.

[REDACTED] met with Macrae at the rectory on the first floor in an office. This office was described as the section of the rectory that sticks out from the rest of the building and is closest to the church. [REDACTED] said he looked at this first meeting and subsequent meetings as counseling sessions. This soon became clouded and the contacts with Macrae over the next three weeks became more like friends being with one another. A couple of days separated the first meetings and then it became a daily occurrence with [REDACTED] spending up to ten hours with Macrae each day. The first session in Macrae's office lasted for a couple of hours.

The counseling session (when first meeting) consisted of Macrae asking about what was going on in his life and about his use of substances. Macrae also confided that he had a problem with substance abuse himself. [REDACTED] said over time he found Macrae interesting as a result of the stories he told about his experiences and travels. While in his first floor office Macrae showed [REDACTED] a handgun and police badge from the city of Baltimore explaining that he was a former police officer. Macrae told stories about how he saved runaways, saved drug addicts from the streets and other accounts. Macrae explained that he stopped being a police officer because he wanted to help people and as a police officer this was not possible. [REDACTED] who was in the height of adolescent rebellion felt that this was admirable and became more enamored. [REDACTED] also became more open about himself with Macrae.

[REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if Macrae asked him any inappropriate questions. [REDACTED]

said he recalls wondering why he would ask some questions but did not have specific recall of what these questions involved. I asked if Macrae ever asked questions based on supposition. I gave the example that other victims have spoken about, that being if they would prostitute themselves for money. ██████ said this prostitution question rang a bell but he can't recall the specifics.

8841

The contacts with Macrae soon developed with ██████ coming to the rectory and being invited to Macrae's third floor living area. They would sit on a couch together and watch videos which Macrae would rent. These were not inappropriate (not porno) and in fact some were Disney movies. As they watched the movies Macrae would sit next to ██████ with his arm around his shoulder. He would escalate this to rubbing his shoulder, upper arm and the back of his neck. He would ask ██████ if this was all right to do. ██████ said at the time he said this, he had no idea what Macrae's ultimate motives were.

The event which ended the three week contact took place in the afternoon of one day while in the third floor of the rectory. ██████ was sitting on the couch with Macrae and watching a movie. Macrae then suggested that they play a game called the "Road Map Game". ██████ questioned what he meant and asked what type of a kid game was that. Macrae said he would start the game and that ██████ could stop it at anytime. ██████ explained that he was wearing an Oxford shirt and no undershirt. Macrae then unbuttoned ██████ shirt from his neck down. As he did so he touch his check and stomach. Macrae said he was following a line all the way down. Macrae got down to ██████ belt line and then put his hand into his pants. ██████ said that when Macrae's fingers touched his pubic hair that he jumped up and threw his hand away from him. ██████ said he was shocked and hurt by Macrae doing this to him and that he was full of adrenalin. He swore at Macrae who was trying to calm him down. Macrae tried to apologize and say that he did not mean any harm and that he hoped that ██████ wasn't offended. ██████ said he was shaking from this experience and he ran out of the rectory and over to ST Joseph's school where he found his mother who was still at work.

█████ explained to his mother about what Macrae had just done to him. His mother did not believe him. ██████ said he understood this later because he had not been a trouble free adolescent. His mother later believed him when she saw that Macrae was arrested (first time) back in 1989.

I asked ██████ about any signs of this event occurring. ██████ said that just prior to the attempt by Macrae that he was especially affectionate on the couch and touching and massaging him a great deal. I asked ██████ if Macrae was sexually aroused when this occurred and after giving this some thought ██████ said he can't be sure.

█████ said that Macrae was a very strong man who liked to wrestle and fake fight with him. he would let ██████ punch him to the stomach as hard as he could to prove that his stomach was hard. He explained to ██████ that he got this hard stomach from drinking and hat his liver was rock hard.

█████ further explained that as he sat on the couch Macrae would sit

next to him and have his left arm over his [redacted] shoulder. Macrae would then have his right hand on [redacted] right leg. [redacted] said he was not really alarmed by this because a lot of trust had built up between him and Macrae and he was looking at Macrae at the time as a father-figure. I asked [redacted] if Macrae also asked if this touching was all right and he reflected back and said he did. [redacted] then told me that the question made him almost feel like he was back at that time.

[redacted] also said that Macrae was always buying him things and spending money on him. This included a lot of bought meals. [redacted] also reported how he was out in a store with Macrae and commented that a watch in the display counter really looked great. Macrae then bought him the watch. [redacted] also recalled getting five and ten dollar amounts from Macrae as spending money. [redacted] also said that Macrae always spent money renting the movies they were always watching.

[redacted] recalls taking a couple of showers at the rectory. [redacted] said he asked to use the shower and does not believe that Macrae saw him undressed. Nor did Macrae ever undress in front of [redacted]. [redacted] never spent a night at the rectory. I told [redacted] that Macrae testified that no one under the age of 18 was ever allowed to be above the first floor. [redacted] said he spent a great deal of time on the third floor of the rectory and this was with Macrae and that on a couple of occasions another priest saw him there with Macrae. This priest's name could not be recalled.

I asked [redacted] to check with his mother so we could fix the year and the possible month that this contact with Macrae took place.

I had interviewed [REDACTED] and he was unable to give an accurate date when he had contact with Gordon Macrae. He was also abusing substances at the time and needed to ask his mother for more information about his contact with Macrae and the dates. [REDACTED] felt that his mother would have more accurate information than he could report. Arrangements were made for [REDACTED] and her son to come to the Keene Police Station or an interview.

0900HRS

I spoke with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] in the Investigation Division's interview room for approximately one hour. [REDACTED] had prepared some notes to refer to to give me approximate dates/time spans that events occurred. Some of the information was different than what [REDACTED] recalled. [REDACTED] said that after speaking with his mother he recalled the scenario and believes his mother's recall and dates are accurate.

[REDACTED] was enrolled in the Landmark School (North of Boston) for the 1985-86 school year. In either late November or early December of 1985 [REDACTED] started to have behavioral problems at the school. His academic abilities were always good and showed no deterioration. [REDACTED] was also showing signs of depression. [REDACTED] was asked to leave the school with the advise that he seek counseling. This would have been in December of 1985. [REDACTED] worked at the St. Joseph school during the 1985-86 and 1986-87 school years. She had heard that Father Gordon Macrae had a good reputation as a result of working with troubled adolescents. She called him up and asked about his counseling [REDACTED] and it was set up for him to do so the same night. This started a three week course of contact between Father Macrae and [REDACTED] that went through the Christmas season of 1985. [REDACTED] would have been 15 years old at the time. This involved their having night and day contact. Macrae would keep [REDACTED] up to date and eventually told her that [REDACTED] was having suicidal thoughts and had reported that he held a gun up to his head at one point. [REDACTED] said he does not recall this happen or telling Macrae about it. [REDACTED] said at the time she asked [REDACTED] about his happening and he told her it had. This caused her to have all the guns removed from the house. Her husband [REDACTED] was living with her at the time. Father Macrae assured [REDACTED] that the crises period was over for [REDACTED] and that he was no longer a threat to himself. This stopped the day to day contact. From December of 1985 until the spring of 1986 Gordon Macrae saw [REDACTED] about once a week on average. This was not a regular schedule, Macrae would call up and say when he had free time and they would then get together. [REDACTED]

██████████ believes that this contact continued until either late April, May or early June of 1986. ██████████ explained that Father Macrae saw ██████████ during these less structured contacts under the guise that he would be able to get more information and have a better chance of positive intervention if he did so versus seeing him during formal counseling contacts. 8844

During this last contact is when ██████████ came home shaking and crying and reporting that Gordon Macrae had tried to molest him. ██████████ had his mother promise never to tell anyone what he was about to tell her. He then reported to her about Father Macrae trying to sexually molest him.

██████████ and ██████████ decided that he should go back to Father Macrae and confront him about the molestation attempt. This took place the day after the attempt was committed. ██████████ was very upset and angry about Macrae trying this with him. ██████████ agreed to do so but insisted that his mother not be present. ██████████ and ██████████ spoke about what he should say to Father Macrae. ██████████ drove ██████████ to the rectory and ██████████ went in to see Father Macrae alone. He came back after 20-30 minutes and told his mother that Father Macrae denied doing anything to him and that he told ██████████ that he was a "screwed up kid" and nothing happened. ██████████ was very angry about this denial.

In September of 1986 ██████████ returned to the Landmark school having been counseled by Macrae. He came home for Christmas 1986 and then returned to the school. His mother was called by the school and told that ██████████ was acting out and she needed to come and get him. ██████████ tried to jump through a window on the second floor and had to be restrained by school personnel. He was then placed in a mental health facility identified as Baldpate Hospital located in Georgetown, Massachusetts. ██████████ stayed there a couple of weeks and then returned home to Keene. ██████████ was not getting along with his father who was also identified as an alcoholic. One night he went to a concert with friends in Springfield, Massachusetts. When he returned his father and ██████████ had some interaction which resulted in the father sending ██████████ to his room. ██████████ left the house and did not return for three or four days. He then ran away again shortly thereafter and his whereabouts was not know until a man called informing ██████████ that he had found ██████████ hitch-hiking. He had shared a motel room with ██████████ in Chicargo. The man went through ██████████ wallet when he was in the shower and called his parents to let them know that he was all right when he last saw him but that he was now back on the road. About three weeks later ██████████ called his mother to tell her he was all right. He would not tell her where he was calling from. ██████████ states that he was in Sacramento, California at the time and he did not tell his mother where he was because he thought she would call the police and have him returned. This was in January of 1987 when ██████████ was 16 years old. ██████████ states that he eventually returned in the Spring of 1987 and lived separately from the family, but in Keene.

██████████ stated that when ██████████ ran away she called Father Macrae and old him about this. He wanted to know why she was calling him since he was no longer seeing ██████████ for counseling. ██████████ explained to Father Macrae that she called him in case he knew where ██████████ would have gone, that he might have a few clues from their

having spent time together. Father Macrae said he had no ideas where [REDACTED] would go but would tell her if he did call. [REDACTED] told Father Macrae that [REDACTED] would probably not call him and he knew why. Father Macrae said he didn't know why [REDACTED] wouldn't call. [REDACTED] told him that she knew that he had tried to sexually molest [REDACTED] and that she had promised [REDACTED] that she would not tell others. Father Macrae started to use foul language calling [REDACTED] a "fucking asshole" and that he had made this story up about him because he had pressed him during counseling to work on difficult personal problems. [REDACTED] said she couldn't believe how foul Father Macrae was as he spoke with her.

8845

I asked about issues Father Macrae said he was working on with [REDACTED]. She said it was on the troubled father-son relationship and with the mother-son relationship. Father Macrae told [REDACTED] that she did not appear to care about her son. [REDACTED] said she told Father Macrae that she loved her son and did not understand how she could say that she didn't care. She is sure Father Macrae probably told her son this during their contact.

[REDACTED] also said that Father Byron knows information about Father Macrae that might be helpful. He has told friends that it was very difficult living in the rectory with Father Macrae. The older priest who saw [REDACTED] in the rectory with Father Macrae was identified as Father Stephen Scruton. Another priest was also present and described as legally blind was a priest called Father Michael. His last name is not known to [REDACTED]. She states that Father Macrae would move the furniture and play other cruel tricks on this priest to take advantage of his failed vision. Fathers Scruton, Macrae and Michael lived in the rectory at the same time.

I called the Winnacunnet High School (926-3395) in an attempt to locate Dr. Robert Brown. No one at the school that I spoke with recalled who he was. I contacted the SAU (926-8992) and they researched their records and could not come up with a current telephone number or address. I called information and they did not find a listing for a psychologist in the Hampton area (within 30 miles) with this name. I ran a motor vehicle search with the name Robert brown and it came back with close to 200 possibilities. I called DET Waudel (929-4444) of the Hampton Police department. Waudel recalls Brown and will attempt to search out where he is at this time.

I called DCYS in Concord (D. Beaton) and asked them for a telephone number for Marilyn Fraser. She no longer works for DCYS. She works in a private counseling business called Precious Resource, the telephone number being 225-4335. I called this number and left a message for Marilyn to call me.

I called Judy Patterson (778-6689) at her office (Employee Assistance) and left a message for her to call.

I spoke with Monsignor Quinn and asked who Father Jerry was. A reference to this priest was made by [REDACTED]. It is believed by [REDACTED] that Father Jerry saw him having some type of contact with Father Macrae in the Hampton rectory. Quinn told me that Father Jerry is Father Jerry Boucher. Father Boucher denies ever seeing [REDACTED] having any contact with [REDACTED]. In fact [REDACTED] reported that he saw father Boucher years after the abuse and Father Boucher did not recall who he is. Father Boucher is presently assigned to a parish in Milford.

I called the San Alfonso Retreat House in Long Branch, New Jersey (908 222-2731) in an attempt to locate Father Michael Barrett and was told that he will return on this coming Friday.

I faxed the attached letter to the Division of Social Services in Lynn Massachusetts seeking records on Gordon Macrae. Telephone (617) 592-3380.

I called Troop C for Trooper Kelly to remind him of his promise to give us further records/information on Macrae's 1988 auto accident. He was not in so I left a message.

I attempted to locate [REDACTED] and met with negative results. [REDACTED] was the 17 year old male who was molested by Macrae at Spofford Hall. I contacted

the [REDACTED] Police and they do not have a listing for this family. I called telephone assistance and although they have a listing for [REDACTED], it is not the correct subject. I ran [REDACTED] name and date of birth through motor vehicle throughout the United States and did not find any license on file. At the time of the incident the family used an attorney, Richard LaSalle. I called his office and left a message for him to call.

1255HRS

I spoke with [REDACTED] and she confirmed that about nine years ago she went with [REDACTED] for a counseling session held by father Macrae. She did not want to comment on what they discussed and the reason for the session. [REDACTED] is reluctant to speak. I told her that I simply wanted to know if she met with father Macrae and [REDACTED] for a counseling session and she confirmed this but did not want to comment further. I asked if during this counseling session if Father Macrae counseled her about getting an abortion and she said she did not want to comment.

1320HRS

I called the University of Massachusetts (413) 545-1515 and found [REDACTED] telephone number listed as [REDACTED]. I called this number but met with negative results.

1345HRS

I contacted Father Peter Lechner's office (505 829-3586) in New Mexico. Lechner has a voice mail system which states he is out of state until January 29th but that he checks his messages daily. I left a message identifying myself and office and alerting Lechner to our April trial date and our need to have him testify. I told him to contact me with regards to where he will be so subpoena service can be made.

Dr. Guertin-Oulette is not listed as a psychologist in the Manchester area. No listing for him is available. I contacted State Licensing and found an address of [REDACTED] Maine, [REDACTED]. I called information and got the following number [REDACTED].

I called and spoke with Dr. Henry Guertin-Oulette who is now retired and living in Maine. He states he will be at this address and can accept service at any time if we need him for trial. He said he is vaguely familiar with the criminal case against Father Macrae. He states he has sparse records, "a few letters", regarding Macrae. He has been contacted once a while ago by Father Macrae, attorney and then did not have any further contact. He did not want to comment over the phone about his contact with Macrae other than to say that he recalls his having counseled him.

Marilyn Fraser returned my call. I told her that we were interested in her possible testimony at Gordon Macrae trial which is now scheduled for April 25th, 1994. Marilyn expressed some concerns about answering questions about her involvement in the case. She still works for the State of New Hampshire but not at DCYS. She said she felt more confident if she could contact DCYS and their attorney about what she can reveal. I asked her to do this and to call me back when she had her concerns addressed.

1030HRS

I spoke with [REDACTED] who is listed as a witness in Macrae's alibi defense motion. [REDACTED] is listed as a person who can attest that [REDACTED] was never present "overnight or otherwise" at the Hampton rectory within the June to October 1983 time span.

[REDACTED] said she submitted a statement to Gordon Macrae's attorney in which she stated she could not recollect a boy with the name of [REDACTED] visiting the rectory. She can not be certain that he didn't. She just can't recollect from the name or from the description of [REDACTED] that was in the letter, [REDACTED], that he had.

[REDACTED] does recall that [REDACTED] lived there and had friends over at times. [REDACTED] said she was confused by the letter from the attorney and further confused when told that [REDACTED] as an [REDACTED]. She can't be certain if he stayed there or not, just that she doesn't have a recall of him.

[REDACTED] identified the cook at Hampton at the time as Mildred Warren (Millie) who is now deceased.

1100HRS

I called [REDACTED] and asked him about the visit to the Hampton rectory. [REDACTED] told me that he recalls the controversy with the sisters assigned to Hampton. He recalls during his visit that their were signs that had the letters "SOS" which stood for Save Our Sisters. He also recalls that at least one, if not two priests, were present when he had dinner in the rectory. He believes he will be able to identify at least one of these men from photos. He described one of those men at the dinner at being tall and thin and having a beard.

I asked about him visiting Hudson families with Macrae. He said he did and recalls one family specifically that lived near the Merrimack River. They had a boy about his age that he played with on visits and recalls their going to a rope swing near the river. He also recalls playing with an entendo game (succor) in the basement of the house. He believes he can identify this house visited. He also recalls visiting another family in Hudson with Macrae as well. He denies ever staying with one of these families when Macrae was not there, as alleged in Macrae's motion (page 11 e).

I asked [redacted] about staying overnight in other church rectories in Nashua and Merrimack. He states he did not stay overnight in rectories in Merrimack and Nashua. Macrae's motion makes reference to police reports. A check of my report shows the line:

"I asked [redacted] about the trips that father Macrae used to bring him on. Most of these occurred on the weekends and sex would usually occur. Such locations as Hampton, Nashua, Merrimack and Groveton are examples of locations that [redacted] went to with father Macrae. On these trips [redacted] and Father Macrae would stay at church rectory or at Father Macrae's friend's homes. Sexual contact would occur in Father Macrae's vehicle and/or at the residence where they stayed for the night". (report #1)

Evidently Macrae inferred that [redacted] meant that he stayed in rectory in the towns mentioned above, when he did not intent to infer this at a

Father Boucher returned my call. I made him aware of what he is alleged to be able to testify to in Macrae's motion to the court regarding his alibi defense. Father Boucher states he recalls the [redacted] family name and some of the kids. He states that the [redacted] boy(s) were at the Hampton rectory a couple of times but he can not recall if they stayed the night or not. He further could not recall if they were there with their parent or with Macrae at the time.

I told him how [redacted] recalls having a meal (salmon) which was served by their house keeper and that two other priest were there. Father Boucher states that the other priest would have been Father George Robichaud who was also there with him and Gordon Macrae. George would have had a beard at the time and is tall and thin and this is consistent with [redacted] description. Father Boucher said that it is possible that [redacted] may have been at the rectory, that he (Father Boucher) was not there 24 hours a day. Father Boucher further stated that he could not argue that [redacted] did not stay the night as he claims or that Gordon Macrae might have molested him at the rectory.

Father Boucher filled out two questionnaires for Gordon Macrae's attorney and retained copies. I read Father Boucher a section from the motion that stated:

"This individual should attest to the fact that [redacted] did not visit the Hampton rectory, overnight or otherwise, with or without the defendant during this time period."

Father Boucher responded to this by saying "not true" that he could not attest to this. I continued and read him about the issue dealing with the lawsuit and news coverage over the nuns who lived on the grounds. Father Boucher stated that this had "nothing to do with it". I read the last section about him as the supervisor being unwilling to tolerate Macrae driving to Keene and his unavailability and he said this "sounded crazy".

Father Boucher volunteered that he had met Gordon Macrae when he was trying to study for a religious order and trying to enter the

priesthood in the New Hampshire diocese. He said Gordon was penniless and came from a dysfunctional family. He added that Gordon told him that his father committed suicide. Father Boucher was the Pastor in Hudson at the time and he offered Gordon a room at the rectory. This room was for his use when he was in between school semesters. Father Boucher said he never had any indication that Gordon was being inappropriate with children.

Father Boucher said that when he worked with Gordon as a priest in Hampton that they knew each other's schedule. If Father Boucher was going to be out for a few days then Gordon knew this ahead of time.

I asked Father Boucher specifically about [REDACTED] claim that he caught him and Gordon having contact in the rectory. Father Boucher said he heard this on the television news and went "catatonic". He states this never happened. He has met [REDACTED] about two times in the rectory and each time [REDACTED] was around the secretary's desk on the first floor. He never saw [REDACTED] on the second floor of the rectory. He does not believe that he ever had a conversation with [REDACTED] that went past a slight greeting when seeing him on those two occasions.

1445HRS

I spoke with [REDACTED] and after identifying myself told her that her name and that of her husband's appears in Gordon Macrae's motion before the court. I said that I was checking to see if she was going to testify to facts listed in the motion. She said this was the first time she has heard of this, but that possibly her husband had more information about this and did not tell her. I read to her what was in the motion and again she stated this was all new to her. She did not want to confirm or deny these facts until she spoke with her husband. She asked why I would be checking and I told her that others were listed in this motion and they were unable to testify to what was listed. [REDACTED] did not feel comfortable talking further until she spoke with her husband. I gave her my name and telephone number and asked her or her husband to call me back. They may be unwilling to speak further.

1500HRS

I spoke with Father Michael Barrett and asked him about [REDACTED]. He recalled [REDACTED] but could not specifically recall if he saw him on the first or second floor of the rectory. He said that Macrae used to "run with a lot of kids" and specifically mentioned the [REDACTED] family. He said he never thought that anything improper was going on between Macrae and any children. He did not think that Macrae's relationship with the [REDACTED] family was anything but appropriate. He said that both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] would be in Macrae's third floor living space watching videos at a number of different times.

Father Barrett discussed how he could not testify that the [REDACTED] boys ever spent a night with Macrae. He states he probably would have seen them leaving the next day if they did stay. He told how he used to have a suite across from Macrae on the third floor and they then switched sides and Macrae had a petition build for further privacy. When Barrett was on days off he was out of the building and can't say

who Macrae might have had for a quest.

Father Barrett recalled a boy with the first name of [REDACTED] who was from treatment center in northern New Hampshire who did spend the night with Macrae. This boy had to be returned to the treatment center in northern New Hampshire the next day and Macrae was unable to bring him so Father Barrett and Scruton did this for him. His full name can't be recalled.

Father Barrett was at ST Bernards from June of 1985 until November of 1986. He said at one point Father Scruton did have a rule that those under 18 were not allowed past the first floor. Father Barrett had his office on the second floor and he was not allowed to counsel children in this office nor allowed to use Father Scruton's first floor office space.

1530HRS

I spoke with Father George Robichaud about his name appearing in the motion. He states he does not remember [REDACTED] (the name) ever visiting with Gordon Macrae or without him. I gave him the description of the meal and those around the table when [REDACTED] visited. He identified himself as the priest with the beard. I told him about salmon being served and he said that this was something that Millie would have served. He does not recall [REDACTED] being there but can't say he wasn't either. He is not aware that [REDACTED] spent the night, but at the same time can't exclude it either.

## Narrative:

01FEB94

I spoke with Leo Demers about his name being in Macrae's alibi defense motion. Leo stated that he has known Macrae for a number of years. This started when Macrae was a student at a religious order located in Hudson, New Hampshire. Leo confirmed that he has communicated with Macrae's attorney and has filled out the questionnaires. I read him the section from the motion (page 3 c), specifically, "Other friends of Defendant in Hudson should state that Defendant visited them every other week in this spring/summer and was never accompanied by [REDACTED] or [REDACTED]." Leo said that although he is sure that Macrae visited, it was not every other weekend and he characterized Macrae's visits as "sporadic".

Leo does not know the name of [REDACTED] and can't recall his ever visiting his home. I asked about his having an entendo game in the basement and he confirmed that his son had these games. His son does have blond hair and is identified as [REDACTED] of Nashua. I was given his home telephone number which is [REDACTED]. He teaches school in Hudson. Motor vehicle records reveal that [REDACTED] has a [REDACTED] and that he has blond hair and blue eyes. [REDACTED] thought the boy he played with on his visit was close in age to his own. [REDACTED] is 24 years old and [REDACTED] is 26.

Leo recognized that we are talking about a visit that might have occurred about ten years ago. He can't recall it himself but his son might be able to recall. Leo is unaware of a rope swing near the river. His home then and now is about a 1/2 mile from the river.

I told Leo that when I spoke with his wife the day prior that she seemed alarmed about not knowing that her name was on the court document. I told him I hope she was not concerned about my call. Leo told me that his wife was in a very "disruptive period" in her life.

1430HRS

I spoke with [REDACTED] and he read a letter which was faxed to him by Attorney Kock. This letter states that he was contacted by several of the persons I had spoken with on January 31st who complained that I was "threatening" and other negative behavior was noted. Kock wanted me off the case because of Macrae's law suit (which we have not yet received service). Kock stated that because of the law suit that I was less than objective. Kock wanted me to notify each person that they did not have to talk to me, that he have a representative from his office present, and that the conversation be taped. I told [REDACTED] that I would not contact any other witnesses in thi

case until I heard back from him. I told him that I was shocked by Kock accusation and that they are groundless. I speculated that the only per I spoke with who might have lead Kock to write his letter was the Demer Mrs Demers was unsure of she should talk so I referred her to her husband before commenting further. She followed through with this and her husband later called me back and answered questions. Kock complaining that I am less than objective pales in comparison to a letter he mailed to potential witnesses. This letter states that Macrae is innocent of charges and then goes on to solicit help on his behalf.

The other conversations I had with witnesses from the day prior were all amiable and a few were actually pleasant. I Told [REDACTED] that I am at a loss with regards to this complaint, if indeed any were actually received by Kock.

I received a call from [REDACTED] who informed me that it was business as usual with regards to my following leads in this case.

1305HRS

I received a call from Father Gorski. I explained to Father Gorski that his name appears on Macrae's motion. Father Gorski said he was contacted by Macrae's attorney some time ago and asked a number of questions, which he complied with. I read the section of the motion dealing with Father Gorski, that being:

"Neither Defendant nor [REDACTED] were ever present, overnight or otherwise, at this church rectory after June 15, 1983. Gordon Macrae was in Keene, and could not have been present at the Hampton rectory between June 15, 1983 and October, 1983 as [REDACTED] alleges."

Father Gorski stated that in came to the Hampton church in the middle of June 1983 and that Macrae never came back and stayed a night with or without an adolescent male. Father Gorski added before I could ask, that he had either Wednesday or Tuesday off each week and he was not present in the rectory for these nights. He thus can't say who was there and who was not.

On page 12 and 13 the motion lists Father Gorski as a witness that Macrae never visited the Merrimack rectory. Father Gorski states this is so. I did not ask further questions about this since [REDACTED] does not claim to have visited this rectory with or without Macrae.

I reviewed the information I had just received from Father Gorski. He confirm the information and I thanked him for the return call and time.

[REDACTED] recalled how he went on an overnight trip with Macrae and another male his age was on the same trip. This occurred when Macrae first came to ST Bernards and he was still an acting priest. [REDACTED] would have been fifteen (1983) at the time. [REDACTED] can not recall the reason for the trip. They traveled by car with Macrae far into the state of Maine. They stayed the night in a rectory. Also staying the night in this rectory was two nuns and one other adult male. [REDACTED] said that this rectory was huge and had 15 or more rooms. [REDACTED] is not reporting any sexual abuse or solicitations.

[REDACTED] did recall how Macrae lied to him and the other boy on the trip. [REDACTED] told how Macrae reported to them how he had two children of his own, how he had adopted another child, and how he was a police officer.

[REDACTED] did not want to reveal the name of the other boy on the trip. He preferred to talk with him first and see if he wanted to participate in this investigation. [REDACTED] said that this other male used to work for Macrae at the church.

I asked [REDACTED] about going to the rectory. He said he was never in the living area of the rectory. He met Macrae at socials conducted after the Sunday masses.

[REDACTED] is going to speak with his younger brother [REDACTED]. He also knew Macrae.

I spoke with [REDACTED] about his recall of a visit by [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] can not remember Father Macrae bring an adolescent boy with him on any of his visits.

1745HRS., INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]

I contacted [REDACTED] at UMASS and he consented to being interviewed over the telephone. [REDACTED] was not all that aware of Macrae's present legal situation and was not contacted by Macrae as a potential witness. This seems odd in light of the fact that Macrae is trying to use an alibi defense and [REDACTED] spent considerable time with him. But as the interview continued it became clear why Macrae would not be offering [REDACTED] as a witness.

[REDACTED] said that he met Macrae through his affiliation with the church. His brother, [REDACTED], also met Macrae and they were both counseled by him. [REDACTED] explained that he did not get along with his brother at the time and his mother arranged this counseling with Macrae. [REDACTED] went on to explain that his relationship with Macrae continued and he felt that Macrae was trying to be his absent father, a situation that [REDACTED] resented.

[REDACTED] made reference to his having stolen Macrae's checkbook and that he had explained his reasons for doing so. [REDACTED] told me that his reasons were documented in police reports. [REDACTED] made it clear that his reasons for committing this crime against Macrae did not legitimize his illegal acts. A review of the report indicates the following:

"I asked [REDACTED] how he had gotten the checks. He said that father Macrae had given him a key to feed his animals one weekend, and that he went in and stole them then. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] had told him a lot about Macrae, that Macrae was a nice guy, but that he didn't think he was a nice guy as [REDACTED] had said he was. [REDACTED] said that this was a way to get back at Macrae by cleaning out his bank account, for something that he didn't like about Macrae."

"I have known Gordon Macrae for about 4 1/2 years. He was a close friend of my families, as well as a close friend of mine. Over the years we spent alot of time together going to dinner, on trips, to the beach, and watching television. After all these years, I started to get thoughts that perhaps Gordon was gay, and that perhaps he had been my friend because he just wanted to use me. He was trying to be a father to me, telling me who I should be friends with, and who I should not be friends with, what to do and what not to do. I didn't like that, and after awhile, I decided that I was going to get back at him for those reasons."

When I was over his apartment feeding his fish, I saw the checks in

one of his drawers. I decided to take some, so that someday if I wanted, I could use them to get him. I took one of the little books of checks. I took these checks on the Thursday before the checks were cashed, which was July 2, 1987."

Now that I have had some time to think about this and what I have done, I realize that I have made a mistake. I really don't think that Gordon is gay, and he was really just trying to be a good friend."

(From Statement by [REDACTED] to SGT Brown/dated 7-16-87)  
(see attached statement)

[REDACTED] explained that early on with his contact with Macrae that a man with the first name of [REDACTED] and who was a member of the YMCA approached him and warned him about being careful around Macrae. I asked what form this warning took and he said that this man told him that Gordon had a life-style that [REDACTED] should be careful about. This matched up with [REDACTED]'s suspicions that Macrae was a homosexual and that Macrae was trying to father him. [REDACTED] believes that his being vigilant about Macrae probably saved him from being sexually abused.

I asked [REDACTED] about Macrae's conversations with him. [REDACTED] said he doesn't know what to believe and what not to believe when it came to Macrae. I asked him if he ever spoke about his (Macrae's) father. [REDACTED] said he did and that Macrae told him how his father killed himself. I asked by what means and [REDACTED] thought Macrae said his father shot himself. He then said he really couldn't recall specifically but felt that a gun was involved. I asked if Macrae ever said anything about is being abused as a child and [REDACTED] said he hadn't.

[REDACTED] said he initially thought that Macrae had a very disciplined life, and that he had a very disciplined character. This was up to the point that he acted strange towards him. This involved his putting his hand on [REDACTED]'s knee while they watched television together. [REDACTED] then reacted by striking back at Macrae by taking his checks. [REDACTED] said after this incident Macrae did not act improper towards him. I asked [REDACTED] if he questions his relationship with Macrae in light of the allegations presently against him. [REDACTED] said that if the allegations are true then Macrae did not lead the discipline life he thought he did. At the same time his over reacting to Macrae's touching might have saved him from being abused. [REDACTED] said, "maybe that's what saved me".

After the check book incident, [REDACTED] said he felt that his relationship with Macrae was normal. He feels that although he was a kid that they both benefited from the relationship. They had good discussions, played chest and went out to dinner together.

[REDACTED] was asked about his contact with Macrae at the church rectory. He said he was counseled by Macrae on the first floor. He recall two or three times when he went to Macrae's living quarters, but does not recall spending much time there with Macrae. His going to the second/third floor involved his helping to move something or his going to locate a book. He does recall pending time watching movies with Macrae on the first floor of the rectory.

I asked about trips he went on with Macrae. [REDACTED] said he recalled going on a trip that involved going to another town and helping a "soon to be priest", who was on a motor cycle, to follow them to either the Surry dam or another dam for an outdoor outing. [REDACTED] does not recall ending the night with Macrae at any rectories. 8855

[REDACTED] does not believe that Macrae owned a video camera. He said that Macrae's sister did own a video camera. I asked about other cameras and [REDACTED] said that Macrae did not appear to be involved in much picture taking. He could not give any facts about his ever owning any camera equipment. [REDACTED] states that he was never video taped by Macrae.

[REDACTED] said that he recalls undressing in front of Macrae a number of times because they often played handball together at the YMCA. [REDACTED] said he would be uncomfortable while undressed in front of Macrae but he is unsure if he felt this way because of the way Macrae was looking at him or because he was in the mist of puberty. This undressing was to shower and [REDACTED] never went into the whirlpool with Macrae.

[REDACTED] recalls the [REDACTED] boys by name. In fact he mentioned [REDACTED] and said he knew him as a friend of Macrae's and that [REDACTED] was an "upright individual". He also recalled that [REDACTED] older brother [REDACTED] stayed with Macrae for about a week when Macrae was living on Summit Road in Keene. He did not recall coming in contact with [REDACTED] but said that he recalls having a conversation with Macrae about his presence.

[REDACTED] said that Macrae facing charges of having sex with adolescent boys is "not shocking at all" to him. That he, "had this premonition a long time ago", about Macrae. [REDACTED] added that he was an altar boy and was in contact with other priest including Macrae's pastor at the time, Father Scruton. He said in light of what has happened in this country with regards to catholic priests, that Macrae's arrest is not a surprise to him. [REDACTED] said he was glad that he was alert when around Macrae and that Macrae "didn't get to me".

[REDACTED] said that when Macrae was arrested in 1988 that this was a "big issue" for him. He was having trouble at home, at school, and with police and then Macrae was arrested. His having a well known relationship with Macrae was not helpful. I mentioned that Macrae was really consumed with reporting to him about his arrest so that he would not read about it in the paper or hear about it from anyone other than himself. [REDACTED] said that that sounded like Macrae but that he never had a conversation with him about his arrest. Macrae later got in trouble for trying to contact him.

[REDACTED] said he recalled Macrae talking about his being a police officer. He said he looked up to him as a result. He did not see any badge or gun like others in this case. He said that Macrae used to have a gun collection and sold it to a local gun dealer.

[REDACTED] told me that someone like Macrae was "denying their own humanity, when he entered into celibacy" and that his crimes were predicable. I did not speak further about this opinion/theory. I did ask [REDACTED] about whether or not Macrae ever spoke with him about sexual issues. [REDACTED] said he tried to bring up the subject of his [REDACTED] having girlfriends

and Macrae did not want to talk about girlfriend with him.

I asked about the intercom between [REDACTED] bedroom and Macrae's apartment. [REDACTED] said this is true and they had this set up when living on Summit Road. When they were going out Macrae would call him and tell him to let him know when he was ready and they would then meet in the parking lot. This intercom worked by radio.

[REDACTED] said his contacts with Macrae involved just the two of them. [REDACTED] said he would never want to be with others since their conversations were personal in nature.

I questioned [REDACTED] about his telling his grandmother and mother that he was sexually abused by Macrae. He gave me some history about his relationship with his mother and how there is no trust from him to her. He said she would never keep a confidence and how she would call the police when ever he did something wrong. He explained that he constantly felt betrayed by her and told her that he was abused to hurt her.

[REDACTED] was brought up catholic and he added that "Gordon helped me out of that". He no longer practices his religion. He said when it came time for his confirmation that he would skip classes and Macrae would help him out with his mother who wanted him to attend.

I asked specifically what caused [REDACTED] to feel that Macrae was coming on to him. He said he was watching TV on the first floor of the rectory with Macrae and Macrae put his hand on his knee while seated beside him. Macrae did not move his hand up his leg or make further advances. [REDACTED] also noted how Macrae would look him over while in the car.

[REDACTED] offered to answer further questions if needed.

A male subject who did not want to identify himself called looking for me. I was not on duty but in the station and took the call. The caller identified himself to me as [REDACTED] asked if I would come and speak with him and that we had gotten off to a bad start some years ago and he wanted to speak off the record about Gordon Macrae. I arranged to meet [REDACTED] at his home in Swanzey at 1300HRS

1215HRS

I arrived at [REDACTED] home and we sat in the livingroom. This conversation lasted for approximately two hours and was emotional for [REDACTED] at times. During the course of this conversation [REDACTED] confirmed that he had been sexually abused by Gordon Macrae. That his stealing Macrae's checkbook and cashing his checks for money was to buy a gun. [REDACTED] wanted a gun because of the power that the gun represents. [REDACTED] wanted Macrae to stop molesting him. Macrae did stop the molestation because as [REDACTED] explained it, Gordon knew I was "serious" about the activity stopping.

I asked about the filming and [REDACTED] said that he still does not believe that Macrae filmed him. It is possible that he was filmed surreptitiously. I told [REDACTED] I had other cases like this. This is possible, [REDACTED] assured me that he did not lie about this in the past. That he does not have any first hand knowledge that Macrae ever filmed him. But he was involved in activities that could have resulted in what [REDACTED] states he saw on video tape.

I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are telling the truth about their molestations. [REDACTED] said they are. He also told me that he was warned by a man with the first name of [REDACTED] that Gordon liked to have sex with boys. [REDACTED] said this man used to go to the Keene YMCA a lot and he was a sponsor of Gordon's at AA. This warning was of little use to [REDACTED] because it came after his molestation.

I covered a number of same-sex male victim issues with [REDACTED]. He has often wondered why Gordon picked him. He realized that he was vulnerable at the time and that if he told that no one would believe him. He also has some confusion about the physical stimulation versus the mental dissonance that he had at the time of the contact with Macrae.

[REDACTED] has a lot of anger towards Macrae for what took place and has

often had thoughts about hurting/murdering him. His studying foreign languages (Japanese and Chinese) have been in case his victimization was ever made public and he had to flee due to embarrassment. [REDACTED] know recognizes this as a course of conduct related to his abuse and attempts at escape. He also has trained in martial arts as well.

[REDACTED] asked about the names of the attorney's representing the other victims. I told him that I would not make any recommendations that I would only reveal their names because it is a matter of public record. I then gave him the names of the attorneys involved.

[REDACTED] believes that if Macrae found out he was a party of this case that he would plead guilty. [REDACTED] feels that he would be believed and that Macrae realizes this. [REDACTED] showed me a letter he has written to send to Macrae. This letter is simply about his studies at school and not about his victimization or involvement in this case. [REDACTED] said he wants Macrae to know what he has been doing for the last five years because they have not had any contact. [REDACTED] is still unsure if he will send the letter.

The only contact has been through Macrae's attorney via a questionnaire. [REDACTED] said he was not asked about his own victimization in this questionnaire. He was asked about [REDACTED] allegation about the filming. [REDACTED] states he answered this truthfully, that he has no direct knowledge that he was filmed masturbating. Again it could have been filmed without his knowledge.

[REDACTED] reflected back and said that Macrae would tell him that 95% of males masturbate and the other five per cent lie about it. He said this is what Gordon would say to him. [REDACTED] asked if Gordon talked about masturbation with the others (victims) and I said he had spoken like this to at least two others.

[REDACTED] was able to tell his mother about his molestation by Gordon last night. He said it was very emotional for both of them. He states that he can think of his abuse and not get emotional, but when he tries to speak about it that he is reduced to tears.

[REDACTED] feels their are a number of other victims in Keene who also are having a hard time coming forward. [REDACTED] does not have any first hand knowledge of others being abused. He does not believe that his older brother is a victim.

I found a voice message on my office phone from Attorney Peter Heed. Peter asked me to call him Monday regarding a call he had received from [REDACTED].

INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]

I met with [REDACTED] in the conference room. He had arrived at the Court House with his mother, [REDACTED] preferred to speak with us privately and his mother waited outside. [REDACTED] also participated in this discussion.

[REDACTED] told us about his plans to leave for [REDACTED] on this coming Monday (May 24th) and how he will be returning for the coming school year. He spoke about his willingness to testify and tell the truth as a rebuttal witness versus bringing charges himself against MacRae.

[REDACTED] said he had been in contact with MacRae's attorney and had filled out some questionnaires. He said he also received a statement about MacRae's character which he was asked to sign. [REDACTED] said he did not sign this document as it was not his words. [REDACTED] also told us that MacRae had some assistance of counsel by a California law professor and with a woman by the name of [REDACTED] who had recently passed the New Hampshire Bar. [REDACTED] had interviewed him and he revealed some of his abuse by MacRae. [REDACTED] was helping MacRae because she was or still is a friend of his. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] was upset with his disclosure and she contacted MacRae by telephone and confronted him. It is [REDACTED] belief that MacRae confessed to [REDACTED] about abusing [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] explained that MacRae is a good manipulator. That he enters a "new society" and begins by getting to know people and presenting a certain image. That he establishes a good reputation before attempting any sexual abuse. [REDACTED] also spoke about MacRae's continued financial support of him. [REDACTED] said that MacRae might have looked at himself as [REDACTED] surrogate father and as a result helped him financially when needed. This has continued to present. It was also discussed that MacRae might be acting out of guilt over the molestation, [REDACTED] states [REDACTED] is unclear to him what MacRae's motivations are.

[redacted] explained that the sexual activity he had with MacRae took place during a two month period during the spring of 1987. [redacted] was fifteen years old at the time. He explained that he met MacRae in 1983 and he is not sure what plans MacRae might have had for him then but it did culminate with sexual acts in 1987. He described a lot of activities with MacRae which included games of chest, eating out, movies and time spent with one another.

All of the sexual activity took place on the third floor of the ST Bernard's rectory. [redacted] estimates that there were five or six incidents in which he was fondled by MacRae. [redacted] stated that Macrae would masturbate him. He also recalled one incident including the which pair of shorts he was wearing and Macrae started to rub the inside of his leg and he [redacted] got aroused. MacRae then suggested a game he called the "robot game". [redacted] was allowed to treat Macrae like a robot and issue instruction of left, right, up and down as Macrae held his [redacted] penis.

[redacted] also reported that one incident involved oral sex. [redacted] explained that Macrae used his mouth on his [redacted] penis. He does not believe that he ejaculated into MacRae's mouth when this act was performed. [redacted] said it was his idea for Macrae to perform this act and MacRae complied.

The sexual acts stopped when [redacted] stole MacRae's checks and then went to buy a gun. [redacted] explained that he was going to kill MacRae and this was the reason for stealing the checks and buying the gun. [redacted] still wants to kill Macrae and talks about luring him over to [redacted] for a visit, where he will then kill him. This appeared to be why [redacted] does not want to participate in a prosecution, because he wants Macrae out of jail and available to be killed by him.
