Re: Sexual Abuse of by Brother Ricardo and Physical Abuse Of while at St. John's Prep.

Dear Mr. Drinan, Mr. Rogers and Brother Keefe:

This firm represents was sexually abused by Brother Ricardo ("Br. Ricardo"), a headmaster at St. John's Preparatory School ("St. John's") in Danvers, Massachusetts while Mr. attended school there. Additionally, Mr. was the target and recipient of severe physical abuse visited upon him by fellow students, condoned by Br. Ricardo and other Brothers of the Community of Francis Xavier ("CFX"). Mr. has suffered extraordinary emotional, psychological and physical anguish in the years since the commencement of his abuse, which form the basis for his legal claims against St. John's, Br. Ricardo, the CFX and the Archdiocese of Boston ("Archdiocese") as the facts below will demonstrate.

in Brigham's when Mr. was approached by several St. John's students who proceeded to severely beat him. He escaped only to encounter two more students who proceeded to beat him as well. Mr. particularly remembers being struck on the left side of his head several times during this incident. Later that day, Mr. was treated at St. John's infirmary by a Dr. Driscoll, the school physician. Mr. spent the weekend in the infirmary at Dr. Driscoll's instruction. Dr. Driscoll told Mr. and his mother that he appeared to be "over-protected." Mr. shew better, however, realizing he had been beaten because of his status as the "new kid" at St. John's.

Shortly after this incident, Mr. and and his mother met with Brother Clemicus ("Br. Clemicus") to report what had taken place. Br. Clemicus' response was that Mr. was a new student and that "a new boy situation" had caused this. Significantly, Br. Clemicus did nothing to relieve Mr. fear, or to see to it that the individuals responsible were reprimanded and their actions were accounted for, nor did Br. Clemicus take any appropriate steps to see that the physical abuse did not occur again.

Mr. Again, Mr. Was beating took place about one month later in a St. John's wash room. Again, Mr. Was beaten badly, receiving many punches to his head. Mr. Company recalls that he was beaten in a similar manner on at least six different occasions. Mr. Reports that all the beatings took place at St. John's, with the exception of the Peabody Shopping Mall incident.

Mr. also reports that after each incident of abuse, he told his Floormaster, Brother Benild ("Br. Benild") what had occurred. Mr. believes that Br. Benild's real name is William Drinan and that he is presently the headmaster at St. John's. Mr. remembers Br. Benild telling the boys who were beating him to "let him [Mr. believes that Br. Neither the Brothers, nor St. John's, ever took any appropriate action to prevent further harm to Mr.

Ricardo's favoritism was based upon the student's availability to be sexually abused by Br. Ricardo. If one succumbed to Br. Ricardo's abuses, one was more successful at St. John's. Functioning in his capacity as Headmaster and brother during the 1960's, Br. Ricardo had unquestionable moral statute that gave virtue and credence to his words and actions. Br. Ricardo mercilessly exploited this sacred trust in order to satisfy his own bodily desires. Further, the failure of Brs. Nicodemus, Salpicius, Benild and Clemicus to adequately supervise the students and teachers at St. John's or to protect Mr. permanent and potentially lifefrom the harm that resulted in Mr. threatening disabilities. life has been fraught with Since the commencement of the abuse, Mr. suffering that is causally related to Br. Moreover, is unable to form lasting relationships, experienced a dramatic decrease in his academic performance, is unable to hold a job or even at this point work, is sexually dysfunctional, has a poor self-image, and has been through three divorces. For has been prescribed various medications many of the above problems, Mr. including Dylantin, Prozac and Tegretol. Mr. claims that he was impotent for two years because of the high doses of Tegretol he was required to take to prevent, or at least lessen the severity of, his seizures. had a promising future in engineering, the injuries While at one time Mr. he sustained as a result of the recurrent beatings have severely impaired his ability to realize his full potential. As indicated by reports generated by many of Mr.

s doctors, Mr. suffers from short-term memory loss, difficulty

	his injuries, after the last of his divorces were finalized, and he began counselling in September of 1993.
	As a result of the damages that Mr. has suffered, he makes several demands upon the Archdiocese, St. John's, the CFX, and Brother Ricardo. First, Mr. insists that Br. Ricardo refrain from having any contact with children until he has sought the appropriate medical attention for his abusive proclivities. Second, Mr. demands compensation for his injuries which are causally-related to the abuse of him by Br. Ricardo, as well as the failure of the brothers and St. John's to adequately prevent him from harm. To this end, Mr. has informed this firm that he is willing to resolve all of his claims for the sum of \$500,000.00 an amount well within the range of settlement in these types of cases.
