## Choir Training Class Planned

A training class for boys aspiring to membership in the Choir of Men and Boys of St. Paul's Church is now being organized. The class, which will rehearse for one hour each week, will cover such basic subjects as the fundamentals of reading music, ear training, voice production, and drill in the various services choristers are required to sing. Any boy between the ages of 8 and 11 is eligible to audition for the choir, regardless of church affiliation.

The Choir of St. Paul's is well known on both sides of the Atlantic for its concerts and recordings. In the summers of 1966 and 1970, the choir undertook concert tours of England.

In past years, boys from

the choir have sung with the Berkshire Boy Choir; in Leonard Bernstein's "Mass"; performances of Britten's "Spring Symphony" with the New York Philharmonic under Bernstein; "Carmen" at the New York Opera Company under Julius Rudel; Britten's "Billy Budd" with the American Opera Society conducted by Georg Solti; and Bolto's "Mefistofele" with the same organization under Lamberto Gardelli. The choir maintains a large repertory, ranging from the sixteenth century to the present.

Boys admitted to the choir after the training period sing Sunday morning services each week, as well as occasional special services

and concerts, both in Westfield and in other cities.
