

Philip Petit has made significant improvement this year. He has indicated that he is conscious of the need for some work in the area of social maturity and interpersonal relationships, and he seems to be working in this area with some success. Positive signs are the way he responded to faculty recommendations last year, his attempts to be less shy, and his acknowledgement of problems in interpersonal relationships.

Some faculty feel that there is still room for considerable improvement, noting that there is somewhat of a tendency to be a loner and that he can be stubborn in pushing his own viewpoints (but now he definitely tries to listen). Mention was also made by some that he should reflect with his advisor on any tendency to get caught up in "gossip".

Philip's intention to postpone diaconate for a year is seen as a good move by many of the faculty.

Philip chose a demanding field education project this year (working with elderly in a nursing home) and the report is favorable, noting his conscientiousness. The summer report from his home pastor is also very favorable.

Since Philip did not request Diaconate, the faculty voted on the issue of his general aptitude for priesthood and his performance this year. He received a fairly good majority of favorable votes.

Dear Paul:

Please forgive the formality of a type-written letter, but there are many topics that I would like to cover and I can get more on a page if I type it.

First, I would very much like to apply for financial assistance from the grant from the Union St. Jean-Baptiste. If I do continue my studies next year, I would be paying the full tuition of \$ 2,700.00 (an increase of \$ 100,00 over this year). I will no longer have the benefit of a \$ 300.00 burse from the seminary, so all things being equal that would be more money I would have to borrow from the bank.

Second as regards next year, it is possible that Ron Gariboldi may oppose my request to not be assigned to a parish for weekend ministry as an acolyte. I hope to be able to depend on your approval and support (vocal and otherwise) should I encounter difficulty in this matter. It has been an important consideration in my decision not to petition for diaconate until a later time. An obligation to a parish would seriously hinder my commitment to work for an M.Th. Thirdly, we discussed lay ministries when you were here in the Fall, and at that time there was some discussion by the board about having the ceremonies in the diocese. I offered to help on such a committee, but received no response. I am curious to know if anything has come of the idea. I am still very interested and eager to help prepare for such a program.

Fourthly, Paul Montminy and W. Pierre Baker will not be ordained until sometime during their fourth theology. I have planned to wait until the end of fourth theology, but if they were going to be ordained in the diocese, I would be at least willing to consider being ordained with them rather than duplicate ceremonies in a matter of a few months. Perhaps they would not be opposed to waiting until late April or May, or perhaps a date just before Lent of '78? Would you be able to sound them out in an official capacity. I do not think it is too early to start planning. I will be interested in knowing what you find out.

Fifthly, we discussed my spending some time in Berlin this summer. I like the idea of working in St. Joseph's Parish, but another angle has developed. There will undoubtedly will be parishes here in Boston who will request help during the summer months. Being close to the library here at the seminary would perhaps allow me to get a head-start on my thesis for the M.Th. degree. I would like your opinion of this possibility.

Sixthly, I have attended the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral on Holy Thursday for the past several years. I intend to be there this year, and I would appreciate it if you would tell Frank Christian that I am more than willing to be of help in any way that I can - lector, acolyte, cantor, etc. If he has anyting specific in mind, perhaps you or he could contact me in advance if necessary.

Seventhly, the same offer as in sixthly is good for the ordination of Bishop Mulvee. Regardless of the day of the week, the seminary is

Seventhly, you mentioned that you might be visiting St. John's for a couple of days in the near future. I would only ask some prior notice so that we can adjust our schedules as best we can to accommodate you.

Flo Bilodeau was here yesterday, stayed ovenight Friday. He is in a D. Min. program at B.U. and stays here. We had a good chat during a very short visit. I am glad that he stays with us, and I wish we could have more priests visit St. John's.

I heard from Marc Montminy that Gerry will have the cast for another month. I feared that this would happen. He had so psyched himself to have the cast off for Ash Wednesday that it must be a real disappointment. He has lost alot of weight, and Erma is very concerned. I do hope that he doesn't make himself sick over this thing! Give him my best.

The E & A process is in full swing so paranoia is rampant here at St. John's! Though I have never had the "pleasure" of being called, I know what effect it has on those who appear before the board and/or faculty. I think that E & A is one of the saddest aspects of St. John's, and on that basis alone I would personally discourage prospective students from coming here. I think that being very objective the process is unchristian. It has nothing of the "fraternal correction" of St. Paul, but smacks of a clandestine "out-to-get-you" approach where faculty take cheap shots at students they don't like without ever having to justify their statements.

I am keeping very busy with committee meetings, schola, classes, field ed. and a number of other things. I hope that it will be a prayreful Lenten season; it is really a challenge to make time for prayer but it is a must.

Hope all is going well with you. Now that your travelling is over, I hope you will be able to spend some time with Gerry. He likes you very much, and has great respect for your work. I look forward to seeing you of at least hearing from you soon. Take care and pray for me as I do for you.
