What had caused this was that in late December the picture that was taken in October of me with the children was published in The Beacon shortly after Christmas I believe and this, in turn, upset the Serranos so much that they went down to the bishop and demanded my removal from the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

- Q. And in fact did the bishop have you removed from Immaculate Heart of Mary?
- 18 A. Yes.
 - Q. How was it he had you removed from Immaculate Heart of Mary?
 - A. Simply by a letter. There was no official notice published in the paper. The people in the parish were puzzled by it because there was no announcement made whatsoever and they didn't know where I was. I called Father Ryan to see if he
