David johnson: first and only semi-annual report novitiate

This is based on david's past four months with us at the novitiate. Already you have the Novitiate teams votation and recommendation of David for first Profession.

I will assume both competence and responsibility for this report. This for two reasons; first, boren was not living with David for the first two months, second, kaymond has helped David in the capacity of Spiritual Director and hence confidentiality enters. All members of the team and David will review this report.

First, I would like to affirm David in several areas and indicate the direction our dialogue took on some points from previous directors. I believe, and have experienced, David to be capable of tenderness and deep compassion. David is most reflective, though not as much as he appears to be, and prayerful. Gifted as he is with a certain natural charm, he strives from christian conviction to have a simple graciousness to others. Jesus and Francis are very real for David and being a franciscan is seen by him as a life to be lived more than as a label. I half suspect his delayed, and well thought out, desire for profession shows his uneasiness in claiming something as an accompolishment that he envisions as a challenge. David did well with a new class by making some friends. David commands respect, at times too brusqely, and does have a definite presence. All this coupled with his voluntary joining of the desert experience indicate a marked degree of interiorzation of values and a good degree of religious maturity.

David and I talked about observations from the past. While the past comes back to haunt us all, David should be credited with real advance. He has real ego strenghland has battled with a certain rigidity. Some questions pertaining to this rigidity were in areas of sexuality and aggression. Emotionally David is most affectionate (He would argue this a bit) and can give affection to younger and older people. There is some concern on my part that David gain confidence in this area with peers of both sexes. He understands this and sees the neeed for personal relationships outside the formation and friar context.

We both agreed to real growth in areas of acceptance into an adult world, lessening of anxiousness and insecurity and a need to develope talents and skills in order to serve and have satisfaction. David wants to finish his education and would like to direct it as much as possible in the areas of Black studies and theology. All along there has been some concern indicated on David's ability to fit in to theeOrder as it is now and to live with people who do not share his values. Perhaps in his earlier life this was seen as intransigence. Personally, from living with David as brother, Novice Master and Superior (and as friend) I do not see this now. The question of renewal is not over, all of us who love the vision of Francis want to search and struggle more with our fraternal life and ministry. I am happy that David has principles and strong values. I suspect that some of David's unease with some of our students and novices reflects on their values more than on his. That is a judgment; I will stand by it. till proven in error.

David found his time in Mission San Antonio last March most helpful. We referred to his evaluation with you and the points discussed there as watersheds. Prayer, future work and relationship to the greater Church are all areas of contined growth from then to now.

There is a quality in David that is singular and should be mentioned. With a phrase, a look and a gentleness that I find very beautiful he is very apprecitive of all the friars who have entered his life.

In the realm of the Spirit gratitude disposess us more to God than anything else. David knows gratitude, feels it and brings it to praise. For all of us who hold him is such esteem our wish is that his profession will be an opening for more of this praise to come to expression.

The friars here are all well. With a little rain to help, the gardens are beginning to shape up. This has been a dry year for Oakland.

DAVID JOHNSON - first semi-annual report, novitiate - March 1976

<u>THE PROFESSED COMMUNITY</u> had mixed observations about Dave: On the one hand, he seems to be using the novitiate year pretty well; prayer is important to him; he is open and willing to learn.

On the other hand, he gives the impression of being rude and flippant (e.g., in answering the phone): he needs to learn to live with people the way they are. He seems to make snap judgements. In many ways he seems to be an adolescent: he lacks gentility and flexibility (people do not ordinarily relate to one another in blunt truthfulness). What is the motivation for his good deeds? Apparently he does not see the value of regular participation in daily Mass. Why? (Perhaps because of the style, rather than because of the frequency; but what does this say about his criteria?) Some have doubts about Dave.

MY OBSERVATIONS:

During the first six months of novitiate, Dave seems to have made some progress in continuing the growth that was noticed in Las Vegas (able to relate to people warmly, a sense of being accepted by people who were important according to his values, an acceptance of his own self-worth, an opennes to criticism). At the same time I think that he feels that he has lost some ground as well, perhaps in the same areas: a feeling of not being accepted (and not accepting) because others live by values that he does not share (and that he says he does not want to share); a lack of responsible criticism).

is behavior is described in the comments of the professed friars (above); in addition, he is diligent in preparing and participating in class, very punctual and responsible about what is asked of a novice, not too consistent about housework (but thorough, and also more consistent after he was told about it). He has been very responsive to advice, has tried to establish regular visits with a spiritual advisor, has done quite a bit of good solid spiritual reading (especially in recent months), and is prayerful in an unnoticed way. de is very reflective. I think that he has rightly wanted and needed more criticism from the group, but he intimidates some because of his quick, incisive comments and negative reactions. Recently he was able to communicate and receive honest reactions and criticism with the other novices. He feels that this is for the better, and is open to growing closer to them, even though he can't see too much in common at present.

David is a very warm person, of great loyalty, of quite superior intelligence with good capacity to verbalize his thoughts (but not always equally adept in communicating his feelings). He has high standards for himself that are real, I believe. He is very innocent, basically, and genuine. He is an integral man. **OFM JOHN 1**

David Johnson - March 1976 - page two

Several months ago I asked David to consider his motivation: was his practice of justice and charity, poverty and concern for the poor and the dispossessed related <u>in his mind</u> to his conscious belief in God and his understanding of what it means to be a Christian. Did he see his life as a Franciscan getting its energy from a personal commitment to God through Christ, however confused it might be? I suggested to him that if he could not see the connection between his life and his beliefs, that he might be running the risk of living a split life that would do little good to either part, and that he should seriously consider leaving. I indicated that these were hard questions, but meant only as qustions, not as my opinion. I feel that he has really taken these questions seriously.

As far as effort goes, Dave has used his time in the novitiate very profitably, especially in the past few months.

He is in no hurry to make profession, and we talked about the possibility of him taking a month off for a type of solitude in the summer or fall, when he might go camping. We also talked about the possibility of him going back to Las Vegas for a few months to get some distance from the present group and to receive some reinforcement in his values and efforts from people whom he admires and trusts. He is quite willing to make up the canonical time in a novitiate house later on.

I think that he has changed his attitude toward school: he wants to return to school and finish college.

I guess that my basic question about Dave is: how happy will he be in living the Franciscan Life as it is, and with the hopes it offers? How realistic are his desires? Is he not only willing but capable of living with others who do not share his values or his approach to Franciscan values?

SELF-EVALUATION: David Johnson - March 1976

I feel that the past five and one-half months at noviciate have been very profitable. I believe I have become aware of many areas that are lacking in the full spirit of the gospels or human well The most important of these areas are: work - I feel that being. my participation is lacking in jobs that "aren't what I want to do" or limited by the fear of inability to perform them; intimacy -I don't think it is a question I have dealt with before and feel a great need to; community life - I have a tendency to write off people I don't like without making efforts to become aquainted with them, and I feel reluctant to share my ideals with people I don't feel (but don't know) share them; poverty - I feel myself attached to more things than I am comfortable with and I have a "my" attitude about a lot of things; obedience - I am still slow to ask permission if there is the chance to be refused, I still have a fear of getting denied rather than an interest in gaining new imput from the person in charge.

There are areas that I feel I have made progress in and these areas are: <u>prayer</u> - I feel more comfortable with more formalized prayer and a certain commitment to "pray" regularly; <u>future work</u> - I have admitted (not wholly accepted) the need to have some type of talent or skill to offer both to help me and those I am to serve; <u>relationship to greater church</u> - a minor point, but one that I feel at the moment, I have come to respect and see a need to remain with the larger body of the church.

I think the direction I want to take in the next part of noviciate is to work on the points mentioned already as being deficient. I think what I need to do is find a director that I can go easily to and talk these things over with. I am especially concerned with the areas of work and intimacy. There are also some past failures that I need to express openly to someone and talk over to come to understand them and overcome my guilt associated with them. I must also come to grips with the kind of service I am being called to that I might prepare for it without floundering any more years.

After David and I talked about my report and this evaluation, we went over the possibility of his going back to Las Vegas this summer for apostolic work; in the Fall he would go back to school (at Las Vegas?), and then in June 1977 he would return to a house of novitiate to spend the required time in a canonical house for reflection, study and prayer. I think that he would use the time well, and there would be no serious reason at that time why he would have to join another group of novices. I told him that during the year from June 1976 to June 1977 I would be concerned that there be some friar to whom he could be responsible and who would be responsible for him, especially in the areas that he has indicated above, and others which might come to his and my attention in the meantime.

I feel pretty positive about Dave's thinking and his efforts at this time. OFM JOHN 1

Very Reverend and Dear Fr. Provincial,

This is to inform you that on Wednesday, November 24, after previous discussion, the Novitiate Team met and voted in the affirmative that David Johnson be admitted to First Profession. We would like to take this ocassion to commend David for the fine manner in which he has lived with the novitiate community. His presence has been positive and has spoken of his interiorization of Gospel values and of his development of outstanding character. We feel that it has been fortunate for the other novices to have had his example.

We would like to make two suggestions based on our concern for David's assignment. First, that his desire to finish his education be given top priority. He has in the past few months discerned some possible avenues for his education to be preparatory to a ministry to the poor and the Blacks which should be respected as <u>call</u>. Second, should he be assigned to the Seminary, it would be primarily for the good fraternal life which he values and for the possibility of probing educational opportunities and only secondarily to help in the seminary work.

We are genuinely interested in David's development, and it is in that spirit of interest that the above observations are made. We will be in contact about details as to place, date and time of Profession.

DAVID JOHNSON -- First semi-annual report after simple profession --, July 1, 1977

Dave has been with us now for six months. He has helped out by teaching math and Black studies, for which the faculty is very grateful. During the last semester, he has grown to become a very vital member of our community. This summer he will be attending the Renewal Institute at the Old Mission, and then next semester, he will be a full-time student at UCSB. He will also serve SAS as sophomore moderator, but will not be teaching any classes here.

As a friar, Dave has added a great deal to our community by his presence, and I think this is one of his strongest assets. Whenever we are together, we enjoy having him with us. I don't mean that he entertains us, but that he brings a certain presence with him that has become very important to all of us.

In his prayer life, he seems to be pretty regular. During the school year, he attends the daily liturgy, which is important to the students, and which he feels is important to him. We have talked about his own prayer life, particularly in terms of meditation and contemplation, and he recognizes the need to be more regular about this and not leave it up to "when the spirit (no caps!) moves." We have slpoken about his reluctance in volunteering or sharing his thoughts when we have a dialogue homily or a discussion about the spiritual life. His reluctance is part of an old problem of self-confidence.

His concept of minority seems to be based on deep convictions, and he easily identifies with the poor, especially in terms of Black youth. He brings this gift with him from Las Vegas, and it has been a valuable influence and witness among us, both for the students and the faculty. Like most of us, this identification with the poor doesn't have much chance for expression in our institutional framework. I have slpoken to him of the challenges he has to offer in this regard to us. I would have to see him drift into taking the status quo of things around here for granted. He has assured me that he has not , and that he does challenge himself -- and others when he feels it is necessary.

Dave's sense of responsibility is very keen. He speaks often of how much he prepares classes and it seems he does put a great deal of thought into his presentations. He has experienced some frustration with some courses, but this may be because 1) it is normal for the first year of teaching, 2) he has not had the benefit of teacher-training, and 3) he is pluctant to "take up people's time by asking questions." Another manifestation of his lack of self-confidence.

One thing that impressed me very much during the past semester was a remark that Dave made about what he would prefer the school be like. It was quite different and more liberal than the rest of us would want for the school, and Dave knew it. Still, he could support what the community is doing, and his support is apparantly whole-hearted. I think that kind of loyalty is very commendable, and ti comes across as the kind of support that adds strength to our spirit and promises creativity from among us.

I think that a lot of rough edges have been honed down on Dave's personality. One the one hand, he has some very strong opinions of certain students (I don't know alcui fellow friars), and these opinions are based on his own principles and convictions. While I do think there is room for more tolerance in his attitude, I also think he has learned to put up with more of the weaknesses and differences in others' personalities. He does not get upset with some people, and speaks of dismissing them rather easily, but to all appearances, this is not more than the usual frustration we all feel from time to time. I really feel he has mellowed a great deal--without compromising what he believes in.

DAVE JOHNSON--July, 1977, cont.

Dave has a warm personality which he shares easily with most people. He is warm and sensitive with the students, especially with the ones he respects and admires or is trying to help. I Have questioned him about how those at a distance might feel when they don't get his approval or attention. He is not afraid to touch students, which some appreciate and need from time to time. I would suggest that he continue this closeness, but I have cautioned him to be careful not to exclude others and to be careful to notice if sometimes one or the other student would rather not be touched.

Along these same lines, I have noticed much warmth and personalism growing between Dave and the other younger members of our community. I feel Dave and Eloy as lower-class moderators will work well as a team, and Dave's friendship with John Linder will be a good channel of communication between the upper and lower divisions. Furthermore, these are men his age, and it is good that he relates well with them as peers.

Withe the older friars, Dave is a little more reserved. He is not aware of how much he means to both Mel and myself. He worries a lot about Mel's opinions of himself, and he misinterprets some of Mel's jesting for real criticism. I have spoken to him about this, but it is hard for him to get his intellectual side to convince his emotional side that he is doing well. Also, Dave feels shy about meeting other friars who come here to visit or who may be at the Mission when we visit there. This shyness is even more evident with regard to accepting invitations from lay people, especially when they are given to us as a community. I have indicated to him that sometimes we just all have to accept invitations as a community outing, and he has agreed to this.

By now it is evident, I am sure, that his biggest area for improvement is in selfconfidence. We have spoken of his getting counselling, and he is seeing Tom Messner regularly--primarily to take lessons on giving counselling, but secondarily to get some positive help in feeling better about himself. I think he talks well with me, and he has indicated that on the home front, his visits with me help clarify things until he can go into depth about them with Tom.

The only other thing I would like to see Dave work on would be on sharing his feelings and "where he's at" with the rest of us more. My hope is that he doesn't feel this would be unimportant to us. He really should contribute more to our times of sharing provided in our various common prayers. We have spoken about this also, and he does see the need to let others know where he is.

Semi-annual Report for David Johnson, O:F.M.

This first part of the report will consist of comments made without reference to David's self evaluation which is enclosed with this report. The second part will be my reflections on the selfevaluation before discussing it with David. The third part will be reflections, if I feel they are needed, after discussing it with David. Finally, everything sent to you will have been read and discussed with David.

I think David has done very well here at St. Anthony's. He is very much a part of the community, and he seems to relate well to all members of the fraternity. He takes part in community events such as office, Liturgy, meetings, recreation, and the rest, While he would, I think feel some improvement could be made in some of these categories, I think that is the case for all of us. We can always improve. David is in there with us in all aspects of our fraternal life-is what I want to say.

This year is one of searching with David, and with this searching, I think, some haunting discontent with the way things are. It is low key, but present. This I think will tend to keep David in the search more earnestly, until he finds more exactly what God wants him to do-what he wants to do with his life. I think the Franciscan life is very much a part of David's hopes and dreams, but it is a time to evaluate and consider and to keep within the consideration even life outside the Franciscan fraternity.

In his working and relating with the students here at St. Anthony's, David has done very well. He is able to show them respect, affection, brotherly concern, and be an effective authority figure for them besides. This has been done in the midst of finishing college studies. With these now completed he will be able to expand his influence especially in the classroom .

After reading the self-evaluation I see that it reflects a number of things I talked about above, the searching, the haunting discentent. In discussing this with David, I will ask him to clarify the remarks in # 2 about community life to zero in on any problems there. In the matter of the "yearly" prefession, I can see the impatience with that if our life lived day by day is seen as adequate external evidence of a real lived profession of the Franciscan life. On the other hand, I personally can see a value in human rituals which spetlight certain values and metives for action. Human life is so full of rituals of various kinds that this one is hardly superfluous, and it represents a very important aspect of cur life . That is my view, and it ne doubt reflects my generation. David's generation has a different view of ritual. We will discuss this. January 1979

Semi-annual Report for David Johnson, O.F.M. P.2

After talking with David I realize that the comments under question # 2 refer to problems centering around relating to people and the values of interpersonal relationships. We talked about the limitations to relationships among Friars. Deep personal friendships are certainly part of that, but not with everyone. We discussed the differences between fraternal life and the special relationships of married life. After briefly discussing these points we agreed that David should try to be more vocal in letting the members of the fraternity here know when he feel certain needs in relationships are not being met. We will continue to discuss this in our monthly meetings.

The renewal of profession went very well, and we made it an occasion for all of us to renew our profession after David had made his renewal to me.

I will be up to San Juan on Jan. 26, and will have a chance to talk with you then, if you have any questions on the report. I also can ask you for guidelines for the coming months.

DAVID JOHNSON -- Second semi-annual report after simple profession -- February 4, 1978

David has been with us for 13 months now. He is presently attending UCSB fulltime, taking courses toward his major, Black Studies. Here at the seminary, he does not teach, but he fills the office of sophomore moderator.

In terms of his contribution to the seminary, I would say that Dave brings a very special willingness to support our work with the students. He shows a great love and concern for them. I have seen him mellow a great deal toward the boys in the last six months. He seems to see further than their external behavior and is more willing to bend with them than he was when he first came here. He is a popular and trusted counsellor. He is a willing listener and enjoys spending time with the students.

In terms of his in-put into our community, on the one hand he is away a lot at the University, but still he manages to be present to us at the times we have set aside to be with each other. He works well with the other friars, and has made some great progress in dealing with differences of approach in terms of how to handle situations. I am referring to the team work that is so essential among the various moderators. Recently we were struggling with some problems related with he students, and because there was good communication among the moderators and the rector, and because Dave did not hold back his contribution and insights, a lot was accomplished among us. It was evident that this was not easy for him, but I was impressed with how he handled the situation, even when it tended to get rather emotional and touch on very personal viewpoints and convictions.

I have noticed that Dave's opinion is highly regarded by his fellow teachers and among us as brothers. I hope this has helped build up his self-confidence. I am not sure, but I think he is more confident in expressing himself to the Rector and older members of the community.

Ad for his progress as a friar, especially in the spiritual life, I think there has been a lot going on and that he needs to see a spiritual director more regularly. This may be going on, but I have no knowledge of it. This being the case, I have to take part of the blame for not checking up on this more regularly. We have talked a little about continuing conferences with Tom Messner, but because of the distance involved, Dave is reluctant to get to it. When I broach the subject, however, he is pretty willing to open up to me, so perhaps most of his felt-need in the matter is taken care of. I just don't want him to bury things and put them off. He has some doubts--how strong, I do not know--about his future with the friars, and I feel he should be dealing with these on a rather regular basis.

Along the same lines, I think he tends to let community prayer times slip by a bit too easily. I realize that he has a heavy load at school and here with the students, but prayer time is important not only for himself but also as a support for his brothers. I think two things are an influence here: 1) some others of the friars are even less megular than he is and 2) Davegets very tired. His energy level is low at times, especially when he is discouraged. I recognize this may indicate a need for time to be alone, but this may also point to the need for more regular spiritual direction. I think if any one area should recieve our attention, it is this. I will try to be of better service to him.

With regard to regularity at prayer, especially as it touches our weekly Community Mass on Wednesdays, I would like to mention that I see a better evaluation

on Dave's part as to how important this time is for all of us. Let me explain: Wednesday is a half day and often there are games that run into the time we have set aside for our weekly community liturgy. I think for a while Dave would have much preferred to be with the students, but I get the impression lately that the importance of the Wednesday gathering has increased for Dave. I'm glad to see this not only because it makes it that much less of a chore but expecially because I think it indicates a growth in willingness to share deeply in our friar-community's life.

With regard to Dave's Franciscan ideals, until hecently, he hasn't said much. However, last week he led a liturgy for the friars in which his ideals about poverty and concern for the poor were expressed. He has suffered some set-backs because of others' remarks, such as "We'll see what you're like in ten years." The remarks didn't come from anyone here, but they did seem to make Dave withdraw and become more reticent about sharing his ideals with his confrers. I don't hhank he gets much re-enforcement here as we do have somewhat a divided opinion on such things and we all tend to stear clear of discussing things like poverty, simplicity of life style and active involvement with the poor. Again, if he were seeing a counsellor more freqently, he could discuss these things. Also, I think he and I should be in better communication about such things.

In closing, I feel it is important at this point for Dave to get more regular spiritual direction. When I show him this report, we will discuss it, and then I will add his comments.

- ADDENDA: This report was reviewd with David, and the following remarks are based on our interview.
- 1. With regard to "not teaching" he will be teaching Black Studies during the fourth quarter.
- 2. Paragraph 2: He wishes he could do more for the boys he counsels. He would like to know more techniques to use in counselling.
- 3. Paragraph 4: He expressed satisfaction that he can now tell others what he feels about how things are going. For instance, recently he told the Minister that he just could not take any more homilies until the end of his quarter at the University. It was hard to get up the steam to say so; but he felt relieved when he did. There is still a problem in that he needs to express his satisfaction when others show consideration for him because it has happened that he feels relief, but others may may still be under the impression that he is still uptight with them.
- 4. Paragraph 5: Dave agreed that this is the area he must work very hard on.
- 5. In general, Dave agreed that the report was pretty accurate. He has since made the move to see Tom Messner on a more regular basis. He has told that he intends to stay on here next year and is looking foreward to it.

David is a person of strong character, morals, and values. He is a man of faith and conscience. He has considerable intelligence, a deep capacity for affection and a gift for intimate relationship.

Beside these solid qualities there appears at times to be some consternation or stress. In Transactional Analysis language, David seems to have a strong critical parent which constantly calls the child in him to task -- holding up stringent expectations and rarely allowing David to appreciate the beautiful person that he is.

The child tends to swing from compliance to rebellion, which leads him to dissatisfaction with self and feelings of gloom (reverencing authority, struggling with it, defying it, and then feeling guilty).

The critical parent holds high expectations for everyone else as well, and few people seem really to meet the mark. The unprized soon discover themselves and quickly pick up strong disapproval.

In spite of the tension between critical parent and rebel child, David has developed a natural child which slips out on sunny days. He can instantaniously brighten a whole room of people with his charm and wit and gracious manner. In his attractiveness he invites those around him to feel at ease, to feel good about themselves. His presence becomes the occasion for them to embrace hope and meaning in their lives.

Perhaps most endearing in the natural child is David's gift for expressing affection and showing concern to others and for entering into meaningful, wholesome, and intimate relationships.

FIRST OF ALL, WE WELCOME WITH SPECIAL AFFECTION

FRIAR DAVID AND FRIAR BEN, I NOW WISH TO ADDRESS YOU DIRECTLY, IN THE CONTEXT AND SPIRIT OF THE SACRED READ-INGS OF TODAY'S LITURGY. JESUS TELLS YOU, "IT WAS NOT YOU WHO CHOSE ME, IT WAS I WHO CHOSE YOU, TO GO FORTH AND BEAR FRUIT."

MY BROTHERS, TO BE A PRIEST IS TO BE CALLED AND CHOSEN TO STAND WITH WOMEN AND MEN AS THEIR HELPER AND GUIDE; TO PREACH THE WORD: TO CELEBRATE THE MYSTERIES, TO PONDER LIFE'S DEEPEST REALITIES, TO RAISE LIFE'S CRITICAL QUESTIONS AND TO CRITIQUE ITS ANSWERS: TO BE CALLED AND CHOSEN AS A

PRIEST IS TO STAND WITH OUTSTRETCHED ARMS AND HEARTS, AS ON A CROSS.

AS YOU PERSONIFY BOTH THIS CALLING AND MISSION "TO BE GENEROUS DISTRIBUTORS OF GOD'S MANIFOLD GRACE" AND TO "PUT YOUR GIFTS AT THE SERVICE OF ONE ANOTHER" AS THE LORD'S ORDAINED PRIESTS, YOU ARE IN A MOST UNIQUE WAY CHAL-LENGED TO THAT "GREATER LOVE WHICH NO ONE HAS THAN TO LAY DOWN ONE'S LIFE FOR ONE'S FRIENDS," TO LOVE THE PEOPLE OF GOD AS CHRIST DID HIMSELF.

FRIAR DAVID AND FRIAR BEN, AS YOU UNDERTAKE THIS CHALLENGE OF PRIESTLY LOVE, MAY I OFFER YOU THREE PERSONAL CONVICTIONS FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION.

FIRST, DO NOT FEAR TO BE WHO YOU ARE UNIQUELY CALLED TO BE AND TO DO WHAT YOU ARE UNIQUELY CALLED TO DO. CHRIST HIMSELF DID NOT HESITATE TO PULL THE TWELVE APART FROM THE PEOPLE - TO ADDRESS THEM IN A SPECIAL WAY, WITH A SPECIAL WORD, AND TO GIVE THEM A SPECIAL TASK. HE DID NOT HESITATE TO PRAY - JUST WITH THEM. YOU ARE NOW CALLED TO BE AN INTIMATE COLLABORATOR IN THE PREACHING OF THE GOSPEL: DO NOT PULL BACK FROM THE DEMANDS AND CHALLENGES OF THAT INTIMACY. EVEN WHEN YOU FALTER OR FALL, REMEMBER - YOU REMAIN THE LORD'S PRIZED AND SPECIAL ENVOY. HE SHALL ALWAYS BE WITH YOU. (CONFER ROMANS 12:1-9)

SECONDLY, THIS IS THE AGE OF PERSONAL FULLFILL-MENT AND INDIVIDUAL FREEDOM, OF PERSONAL GOALS AND INDIVIDUAL

ACCOMPLISHMENTS, OF PLEASURE AND COMFORT. PARTICULARLY AS A FRANCISCAN PRIEST, YOU ARE THE SIGN OF A DIFFERENT FOCUS: THAT OTHER-DIRECTEDNESS WHICH WAS THE CHIEF CHARAC-TERISTIC OF THE LIFE OF CHRIST AND OF OUR HOLY FATHER, FRANCIS OF ASSISI. YOUR TREASURES, FRIAR DAVID AND FRIAR BEN, MUST BE THE POOR, THE HUNGRY, THE HOMELESS AND THE UNEMPLOYED, ORPHANS, THE ELDERLY, AND THE LONELY: OUR OFTEN-AIMLESS AND ALWAYS-SEARCHING YOUTH; THE USED AND ABUSED, THE NEGLECTED AND REJECTED. THE "LEAST" OF OUR BROTHERS AND SISTERS. YOUR TREASURES, TOO, MUST BE THE HURTING PEOPLE AND PEOPLE LONGING FOR HEALING - THOSE WHO HAVE NOT HEARD THE GOSPEL. THE UNCHURCHED, ALIENATED CATHOLICS, SINGLE PARENTS, OUR DIVORCED AND SEPARATED BROTHERS AND SISTERS. ALL THIS REFLECTS THE WORDS OF ISAIAH THE PROPHET, WORDS SUBSEQUENTLY EMPLOYED BY JESUS HIMSELF TO DESCRIBE AN ESSENTIAL ASPECT OF HIS MINISTRY AND, THEREFORE, THAT OF THE CHURCH AND OF YOURS: "THE SPIRIT OF THE LORD GOD IS UPON ME. BECAUSE THE LORD HAS ANOINTED ME" AND SENT ME TO THE LOWLY, THE PRISONERS, THE BROKENHEARTED.

THIRDLY, REMEMBER THAT YOUR MINISTRY TAKES PLACE "IN THE WORLD" - IN ALL OF THE UNREDEEMED SPHERES OF HUMAN EXISTENCE. FRIAR BEN, THIS IS WHAT I THINK YOU MEANT WHEN YOU WROTE, "I READILY ACCEPT THE SACRAMENTAL ROLE OF THE PRIEST, BUT SEE THE NEED TO BE MORE THAN A DISPENSER OF SACRAMENTS." IT IS TO THE WORLD THAT THE MESSAGE OF SAL-

Dear Neal:

I received the report on David for the month of November, thank you very much. As you say, it does seem he is making progress. Though in reading through the report, I noticed that there are some break-throughs, but lots of problematic areas seem to have emerged or continue to emerge. So it still looks like there is a long way to go.

A couple of questions; one is that I talked to him on the phone about the possibility of more intensive therapy, perhaps a second therapist, someone like Jay or Bob Goodkind, I think it was that we discussed. I noticed in one point, Sarah comments that he did not have any confidence in her. I would hope that we would come to the end, and find that he did not have confidence in who he had been working with and therefore, or that the therapy had not really taken. I am not sure just where that is right now, although as I do think he does have some confidence in her anyway. Nevertheless, my question is still whether it is intense enough, given what he has to deal with.

I am just wondering what the prognosis is in terms of how much longer you would expect him to be there? If there is any indications of what you see for the future? Of course, I am sure everyone wants to know those things, but I like to be a little forwarned. Also whether you are desirous of some kind of visit there after the first of the year. I know that David is thinking of something like February and that will come up very fast after the break, and so I would at least be prepared.

I do see that David decided to resign from the parish in Seattle. I appreciate your advice to him, both you and the staff, and I think it was helpful for him in working through it. I do feel good that he has arrived at this on his own, even if it was by using some quite negative factors. I do think that it is better that he move on, and now it will be up to us to look for the right kind of assignment. These are not easy. The recommendations are always a good community, supportive good in numbers, a place where one can be very open and receive and give affection easily and all of that. And I don't know of that we have even one that really meets the bill, but we will do the best that we can.

Again Neal, thanks for your help and for the good report that was sent. We will look forward to the next ones.





I was ordained to the priesthood in 1984 and have worked chiefly in parochial ministry since then. This is a ministry which I have enjoyed very much and one which I believe I have accomplished well. I would not voluntarily wish to be excluded from this ministry.


However, because of some personal difficulties, my ministry in recent years has been more and more restricted by my religious superiors. I believe that they feel they have no other choice under the circumstances; however, this does not allow me the freedom to continue in the priestly ministry as I have done in the past, nor does it permit me to find circumstances where I might function as a priest in the future – something I earnestly desire..

Because of these circumstances, having pondered this decision for a long time and having been told by my religious superiors that my situation will never improve, I am asking to be dispensed from my solemn vows as a member of the Order of Friars Minor for the peace of my soul, that I may better contribute to the work of the Church. I understand that I cannot exercise the priestly ministry until I am accepted by a benevolent bishop.

Dear David,

I need to make a few points and explanations.

I talked with Israel right after our phone conversation. Israel simply has not made a decision about Dr. King. No full report of your treatment nor any conclusions of this has ever been received by Israel. So, what work you may have done in writing out things from your history, etc. is not known, nor what insights you gained, nor what realizations you came to about your offenses, nor what concerns and empathy you may have arrived at concerning your victims, nor what you understand that you need to do to take care of yourself and avoid further offenses are all unknown.

The meeting that I planned with you and Marion is not adversarial in nature, although it may feel that way to you. The purpose of the meeting with both of you present is to talk about the role of the monitor and how this is to be carried out in your case. The role of Monitor and of myself, as Monitor of the Monitors, is conceived to be a supportive one. The general role is to add support from the friar community to the work you do with the therapist, To carry out this role the Monitor needs to know something about what are risky situations for you and to inquire how you are observing your prevention plan, how you are taking care of yourself to keep safe; how things are going for you with the friar community; how your prayer life is helping to support your prevention plan, how your work may help or endanger your prevention plan and similar things, or how anything in your life that week might be moving you toward a risk situation. He is to be an external observer to help assure you carry out your prevention plan, to both encourage and support your observance ad to raise concerns if you seem to be going beyond boundaries. The monitor must additionally represent the interests of the province that you do not re-offend.

He also, in some fashion, is to help assure the province that you are keeping safe from further risky situations. The province stands to loose millions of dollars if some friar from the After Care Program gets into a risky situation, or is even perceived by another as entering into risky behavior. The Province is required by ethical and moral situations, by law and the settlement agreement of previous law suits, by our insurers, and by the Church that we be able to demonstrate that we are doing our best to assure that any friar who has previously offended does not offend again. All the information available from studies show that the person who has offended sexually is never totally risk free, even though he may have All the information available from studies show that the person who has offended sexually is never totally risk free, even though he may have gone many years without even thinking about it. Part of the role of the monitor is to be sufficiently aware of what for you personally may led you into a high risk situation so that he can through the interviews and his own observation can call your attention to any risky situations you may be moving towards.

Although this process of monitoring is unpleasant and uncomfortable both for the friar in the After Care Program and for the the monitor, it is necessary to demonstrate the Province's taking seriously its responsibility to see that the Friar does not re-offend. The Friar in the After Care Program is a member of the Province and whether he will it or not does represent the Province in all that he does. While this is unpleasant for all of us, the friar's victims continue to suffer from what happened to them. The After Care Program is NOT a punishment nor an attempt to make the friar pay for what he did to the victim. Forgiveness is part of our Christian lives, but any suffering of the After Care Friar and/or the monitors must be seen in light of the ongoing suffering of the victims.

External restrictions on your movement by means of having you report your going out and your return is to enable the Province to demonstrate that we are monitoring you with the viewpoint of keeping you out of situations that may be risky. We need to be able to assure victims, the church, the province, our insurers, and society -at-large that we know where you are going, have been and the length of time gone so that we can say that we are reasonably sure that you did not or could not have offended.

Now, Israel asked me to inform you that Dr. King has <u>not</u> been approved by the Province as your therapist beyond the one time meeting with myself and Marion. If you wish to see Dr. King you will have to arrange for payment; the province has not approved. The Province has with serious thought and reflection and consultation developed the After Care Program and has made a commitment to work with the IRT. The province is paying considerable sums of money for the therapy of the friars. Individualized or private arrangements for therapy are not a part of the program nor of where the Province will invest its money.

To you this may seem to be taken you back to what you have already done. This reaction need to be viewed in the light of at least two considerations.

1. You never made a full termination of your therapy with Dr. King. The kinds of assessments that would accompany such a termination never took place, or at least were never reported to the IRT. In the case of persons required to attend therapy by a larger entity, such as the Province, are not free to merely informally agree to terminate therapy.

A. The termination process with your therapist would demonstrate

that you had covered all the relevant issues in a systematic fashion, and that clear conclusions had been arrived at about your risks, your post-therapy program would have been established and given to the Province and a risk prevention plan would have been given you and shared with those administering the After Care Program.

- B. Some tests would have been administered and their results reported to those in charge to provide documentation that the Province could act responsibly in removing any restrictions on your movement or any reporting requirements about your movement.
- 2. The surfacing of new, serious, and substantiated allegations that were not on the table at the time of your treatment (as happened this past Fall) brings matters back to the table.
 - A. It requires the Province again to assure itself through testing and re-evaluation that you have sufficient internal controls as to not seriously be at risk of re-offending.
 - Your angry reaction to attempts to meeting our requirements by whigh we assure ourselves of your effective internal controls raises questions about the strength and effectiveness of these inter controls which are at the heart of a After Care Friar being able to self monitor..

In the absence of any documentation about the outcome of your previous therapy, and in light of the new allegations, the Province has a moral, ethical, legal, and financial obligation to bring you under the monitoring process, to obtain some new evaluations of your internal control mechanisms, and to ask you to restrict your unsupervised activities outside of the Retreat House until such time as the assurance which we need that you can responsibly self-monitor can be obtained.

I am also asking Marion to begin some kind of monitoring process at this time, since the IRT feels that we cannot responsibly continue to put off this exercise of our responsibility as a province. (See attached letter to Marion). Basically, I am asking Marion at this time to begin to meet with you on a scheduled basis of once a week (even for a brief period). I am asking him to discuss with you:

- 1. How you are doing in general?
- 2. How you are doing to take care of yourself in light of what you've learned of yourself in your previous therapy ?.
- 3. What you are doing to avoid risk of re-offending?.

- 4. If you have encountered any high risk situations and what you have done to avoid them or extract yourself from them?
- 5. How is your prayer life?
- 6. What may be particularly stressful situations you are encountering and how you are handling them?
- 7. What are you doing to socialize?

I am also asking you to inform Marion when you are leaving the house (except for short term routine things, like going to the bank, shopping, parish duties, post office, etc.) inform him where you are going, and inform him when you return; and that until such time as a risk assessment is given by a therapist who says that there is no risk for you in long (4 hours or more) unaccompanied trips that you refrain from such bicycling trips and overnight camping trips.

Israel and I want you to be clear that there is no payment from the Province for Dr. King beyond the one visit of he, yourself, Marion, and I. Sincerely,

The background to the copies of the enclosed letters is this:

I had asked David Johnson if I could come down and meet with him and Marion to speak to the two together to get the monitoring going. I had been putting it off a bit, first, to hear David's response that he was going to stay there and try to co-operate and secondly just to give him some time to cool down a bit, as well as to try to figure out how monitoring should work for David. Israel felt that we should get going with it. David was most reluctant that I come and kept saying things like can you not handle it by letter or phone call. I said no that that would not really do. Finally, he said that I could come on Thursday (tomorrow).

Then, this morning David called and said that he really did not want to meet with me and Marion unless Dr. King was present. I felt that that was probably the only way that I was going to get to talk to David, so I agreed.

I was scheduled to talk to Israel by phone right after that anyway. When I brought the matter up to Israel, he did not feel that it was too good an idea. The IRT has not yet approved Dr. King as David's therapist, and may select some one else. Israel felt that by allowing Dr. King to be there as some one on David's side, I was giving into David's adversarial view of the whole thing. I said that I did not think that I was going to get to talk to David any other way and that David was going to talk to Dr. King no matter what I did. So, he agreed to this one time meeting of David, Marion, King, and myself.

He had me remind David that since Dr. King was not approved as a therapist, that Dr. King would not be paid by the Province.

Anyway, that is the background to the two letters that I am enclosing.

MOST HOLY FATHER

The priest, David Johnson, a solemnly professed member of the Order of Friars Minor, has implored Your Holiness for an indult separating him from the religious institute for the reasons given.

The Congregation for the Institutes of the Consecrated Life and the Societies of the Apostolic Life, attentive to that which was set before it, agrees to the request, that the petitioner leaving aside the religious habit, remains separated from his institute, by which, according to the norms of Canon 702, he cannot request antying from it for any work done in it. In addition the prescript of Canon 702 must be observed that equity and evangelical charity is owed to the member who separates from it.

The petitioner will be unable to exercise the sacred orders until he finds a Bishop who will receive him into his diocese, according to the norms of Canon 693, and permit him to exercise the sacred orders.

The present rescript, unless it is rejected in the act of notification by the petitioner, confirms the dispensation from vows and all other obligations arising from profession.

Votum of the Minister Provincial for Rev. David Johnson, OFM

With a heavy heart, I write this votum for a dispensation for the Reverend David Johnson (n. 3/5/51). In 1994, the province of St. Barbara had a series of allegations of sexual abuse of students in our minor seminary during the 1960s and 1970s. There was an allegation against David Johnson at that time. Later, in the 1990s, there was another allegation from a different student against David. The alleged action took place during his years as a teacher at the minor seminary. As a result of the allegations and in order to obtain faculties for him with the local ordinaries, certain conditions to minimize the risk were placed upon David's external ministry. Quite recently, there was a new allegation against David. With the new allegation, further conditions would be placed on his ministry. David did not want any more conditions and felt that he did not and could not have much of a future with the St. Barbara province and other Franciscan provinces and dioceses in the United States. Hence, he is petitioning for the dispensation.

The Definitorium of the province of St. Barbara, at the meeting of January 7th to January 12th, 2001 unanimously approved the request for the dispensation.

I think that this is what is best for David and for the province. There will be no scandal should the request be granted. I recommend the dispensation.
