



'Pastor of the Year 2000' is dead at 60

OCEANSIDE - The strain of leaving Old Mission San Luis Rey, where he was a novitiate, teacher and then parish priest for 17 years, may have been too much for the Rev. Father Martin KcKeon, friends said vesterday.

Father Martin, 60, called "Pastor of the Year 2000" by his associates because of the innovations he brought to the mission built in 1778, was found dead vesterday in his parish center apartment.

He had been preparing to turn the parish duties over to a new priest, and he planned to take sabbatical leave prior to assuming a teaching. bald priest reminded some people of

Another priest found Father Martin's body in the bathroom of his apartment after he failed to appear to officiate at the 11 a.m. Mass. He apparently died while getting a glass of water, possibly during the night. An autopsy was scheduled. 1.1.1

"A plum of a job, he called it," said Loretta Heiser, his secretary for 17 years. "Maybe he hated to leave, but he was not the type of person to show it. He was a great boss who left you alone when he knew you were doing your job. We'll all miss him very much."

The short, bespectacled and nearly

"He never turned anyone away hungry. He was a good man and he had his heart for the people, in following the tenets of St. Francis of Assisi, who founded our order," said his colleague Brother Leo.

"He came back here in 1969 when the area was starting to boom, and he made things happen. When I was here in 1958, there was nothing. We had missions to St. Mary's in Oceanside, to St. Francis in Vista and to San Marcos and Fallbrook. It has all grown."

Brother Leo said Father Martin opened the parish and its center to all faiths; began programs for senior citizens: pushed adult education;

sponsored blood-pressure clinics, a hot-lunch program and the SHARE program for the poor; and provided mission facilities for the Women's Resource Center, which aids abused wives and children.

Joe McKnight, director of education at the mission, said the little man with the big heart had many pressures other people didn't see.

"If you get fooled by 99 out of 100 people you serve, and you help one person in need, do it," was Father Martin's motto, McKnight said.

"He had pressure of paving off the (mission renovation and other debts), and change is hard for all of us," he said.

He first taught in a Franciscan seminary and later became the order's first full-time vocations director. Many joined the order be-

cause of McKeon's encouragement, Vitale said.

In 1969, McKeon became pastor of a then-small parish at the historic mission here. Under his guidance and leadership the parish grew from 500 families to 1,500 families, Vitale said.

Joseph McKnight, director of religious education at the mission, said McKeon "did a lot of things (for his parish) that people will never know about."

Remains were interred in the Friars Crypt at the mission cemetery.



and funded, though still housed at the mission.

A woman who is a victim of domestic violence can't take one step toward a safer future until she has a sanctuary for herself and children. The Woman's Resource Center is such a refuge. It guarantees abused victims safe (and secret) housing for 30 days. Visitors assist in cooking and housekeeping, while counselors at the Mission office help them search for jobs, find permanent housing, obtain legal advice or apply for public assistance if they are eligible. In other words, they will be presented with viable alternatives to a life of abuse.

In 1983 the Women's Resource Center received 3,150 requests for assistance and also assisted in 171 rape cases.

Item, an interesting edict of which you may have no previous inkling: A percentage of every fee paid for a marriage license in this state goes to support agencies that assist battered women.

That informational tid-bit comes from Sharon Newcomb, the capable coordinator of community services and education for the Resource Center. Newcomb, by the way, is a volunteer, one of 85 volunteers who are trained quarterly in special classes at the Center.

The Center is funded by various community agencies, including United Way. Newcomb says that several fund-raising events are held during the year; she responds to many requests to speak to local organizais 757-1200.

"Pain and Possibility" is the title of another of the classes the McKnights teach at the Mission, for people learning to cope with stress.

That title in a different context might be applied to Father Martin. The "Possibility" is eagerly attempted; the "Pain" is toiling through a bureaucratic cocoon with an expanded staff, a bulging budget and nagging statistics which can't be lgnored. Programs relating to human needs cost money; like everyone else, the parish must pay the mortgage.

"I would have to say that our greatest problems now are financial," Father Martin admits. "In the past our principal source of support. was bingo. We are now receiving hurtful competition from the Indian reservations, which can offer Las Vegas-type stakes since they are not restricted by state legislation. So we are always on the lookout for ways to increase our income.

"But the possibilities of enriching the lives of people in our community through our classes, or easing their burdens, are just too tremendous to put on hold."

Martin is a natural optimist even, he says, about the fate of the earth.

"Of course I'm concerned about the arms race, but I think nations will of necessity work through their discords to preserve the earth. Of course I do believe in the providence of God. Our charge is to affect the fate of the earth.

"We always have to struggle against our own weaknesses, but


Father Martin's formula for kindling cooperation among groups of parishoners with differing opinions is just to listen, which he believes is a rarely cultivated technique and a prelude to persuasion.

"I think to listen - really listen is disarming to one's critics. I don't force my ideas on people. If you disagree on an issue, being belligerent makes the division greater."

When Father Martin was asked to name the one person who had been his greatest life inspiration, who had formed his values, his reply:



Not surprising. Casa de Amparo means House of Refuge; it has become almost a talisman for North County residents who have nowhere else to turn. It's a home away from home, often a home better than home.

When the Department of Social Services is called on to investigate charges of child abuse, Casa keeps the child for 48 hours, or until permanency placing can be arranged.

"Or, if a parent dials Casa and says 'Help me, I'm scared I may abuse my child,' we keep the child until the situation eases," explains Sue Richardson, one of Casa's directors. "Or, we get 'transitional' teens — kids who have been washed out of home or foster placement or psychiatric hospital," says Judy Haworth-Adams, the other director.

Mission pastor dies

Father Martin J. McKeon, O.F.M., 60, pastor of Mission San Luis Rey, died suddenly at his home Feb. 26.

Father McKeon was born on Dec. 2, 1925, in Los Angeles. He entered the Franciscan Order on June 11, 1945, and was ordained to the priesthood on June 8, 1952, at Santa Barbara Mission.

During his priestly ministry, Father McKeon taught at the Franciscan Minor Seminary at Santa Barbara and the College Seminary in San Luis Rey. He also served as vocation director for the western province of the Franciscans. For the past 17 years he was pastor of Mission San Luis Rey.

Because of his innovative programs at the Mission, Father McKeon has been referred to as the "Pastor of



the Year 2000." He was responsible for opening the parish center and its activities to people of all faiths. He organized programs for senior citizens and sponsored hot-lunch programs, providing food for the needy. Space also was provided for the Women's Resource Center, which helps abused wives and children. Bishop Leo Maher

The Definitorium met in San Luis Rey the last week in January. During that time I had a good talk with Marty about his proposed change. He had been talking for some time about making a change and reminded us that he had been pastor for 17 years. In his usual spirit of generosity he was willing to move to any assignment, but felt it was only fair to his successor to wait until the development drive was well under way. We did not spend a lot of time discussing a future placement. We noted he had been in the saddle a long time and encouraged a sabbatical. He reacted to this with almost childlike delight. He said he had not even thought of such an opportunity. The weeks following were ones of disengaging, while preparing for a new future. Still we know it was hard for him to break away from so many people he loved and a place so familiar. Perhaps he had a premonition that he would indeed terminate his pastorate there, but would not leave San Luis Rey. With some irony a few days before a parish farewell celebration, and just hours after attending a dinner in his honor including the mayor of the city, he died suddenly and very unexpectedly. No one recalls any ailments nor his complaints of unusual pains. The autopsy said: "hardening of the arteries." The heart stopped. A crowd of 1,000, including over 100 priests, gathered on the lawn in front of the parish center -- a vibrant symbol of his pastorate -- for the Mass of the Resurrection on March 4. Bishop Maher of San Diego celebrated the Mass. The night before the Hispanic community celebrated the Rosary, complete with mariachis. Following the Mass Martin was buried in the crypt beside the mission. A bountiful lunch followed. There was shock and sadness among the family, friars, friends, and parishoners, but a loving memory was shared in a spirit of joy and celebration so typical of Marty.

Marty Mc Keon's life as a friar could be divided into two periods which split his 34 years as a friar-priest. The first half was spent in what we called "internal ministry" or sometimes referred to as "fraternal ministry." After his ordination he was sent to teach at St. Anthony's Seminary. It is said that young friars with abundant energy and unrestrained enthusiasm were sent across the street to the seminary. Marty had that exuberance and lasted at the seminary for 11 years. Perhaps he made his mark of fame when he succeeded Father Martial as prefect of discipline. However, he is perhaps best known for his work in recruiting vocations. While at the seminary he would head off, with other friars from the staff, and "blitz" the schools in Los Angeles and other dioceses and recruit for the seminary. The response was overwhelming and the seminary student body grew to over 200. Marty's vocation work was so successful that the



Many thanks for your letter concerning my appointment to San Luis Rey Parish. I am grateful for the opportunity to serve in pastoral work. I really think I needed a little of the satisfaction that comes from working with people in a positive manner and experiencing more positive results. I appreciated and enjoyed my work in the vocation office, but as much as I wanted to be involved with change in vocation approach, I was also disheartened by the results. The more I thought of change, the more I was convinced that the whole structure of recruitment traditionally accepted was completely wrong. Until I could face this reality, there would be more ulcers. But I am still greatly interested in the vocation picture and hope that my present duties will not make me lose interest nor narrow my views -views that came from the broad experience and opportunities offered me these past five years. For this reason I will enjoy helping you in vocation work in Southern California whenever you want me to.

- Regarding Father Robert Crittenden, I have had a difficult time reaching a decision. I have just received a letter from him telling me how much he wants to be here. However, I really wonder if he knows what he wants. Having seen him and listened to him these past few months, I am quite sure that after he is working with me for awhile some of the old problems will be back. For this reason I have reached the following conclusions for his own good.
- Since he plans to get his degree in library science this summer, I suggest that he be in residence in the Los Angeles area for "higher studies." This will be his assignment and will give him independence. Moreover, he will be forced into directing all of his attention to obtaining the degree without any concern or involvement with San Luis Rey. It will also lend prestige to his position as a student.



Family' Pastor Celebrates **25** Years In Priesthood

The big happy family is the congregation at Old Mission San Luis tion of e in Rey, and the head of the household is 1 her Father Martin McKeon, pastor, Father Martin, as he's called by all the ng out parishioners, recently celebrated his 25th anniversary as a priest. And his "family" all turned out to honor him.

The Rev. Leo T. Maher, bishop of the Diocese of San Diego, was the principle con-celebrant at Father Martin's jubilee mass. A reception followed in the mission gardens and that evening alm ost 500 members of the parish, clergy and friends honored Father Martin with a dinner dance held at the Staff NCO Club, Camp Pendleton.

Father Martin, who was raised in Long Beach, was ordained in 1952 at Mission Santa Barbara after attending San Luis Rey Seminary College.

Assigned to St. Anthony's Seminary as a professor of Latin and English, Father Martin did graduate studies in English, drama and pastoral psychology at the University of San Francisco, University of Notre Dame and Catholic University during the summers. In 1964 he became director of vocations for the Western Province of Franciscans. He returned to teaching in 1968 as a professor of Scripture and English at San Luis Rey Seminary College, but when the college was closed in May, 1969, he was appointed pastor of the Mission San Luis Rey parish.

During his eight years at the mission, Father Martin has watched his congregation grow from 550 families to almost 1,000. He's helped guide and direct many programs within his parish and his community.

Several years ago the parish established The Center For Human úinder. offered Enrichment, a counseling center which last year alone served more than 700 biology individuals in the community.

A youth center, open five days a week after school, was opened for youngsters of the entire community to enjoy arts, crafts and athletics after school. Special vacation programs include field trips, swimming and preschool activities. A parish Montessori School was also established last year.

A major addition to the church itself was the installation of a new Von-Beckarath pipe organ that was custom made in Germany. Only four other organs of this type are in the United States, and they are annually inspected and maintained by a special team from Germany, Father Martin explained

Right now, Father Martin is busy working on the mission's annual fiesta July 16 and 17, and since the parish will be taking over the 12-acre academy grounds and facilities in September, "We'll be busy," said Father Martin. The academy will be made into the parish center. "We'll be starting a senior citizen program there and will be moving many of the other facilities to the complex, including the offices and St. Vincent dePaul Society

In between all the parish activities Father Martin finds time to be 2100 concerned about the people in his Med community. He was a member of the City of Oceanside Human Relations nut Commission for six years, serving as chairman from 1973 to 1975. For the past of i and five years he has been on the board of directors of the Oceanside-Carlsbad UR. Family Service Association and was the director of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Commodity div ar Program in North County from 1971 to P! 1976

In October Father Martin will be taking a break from it all. He plans to leave for Europe with some neighboring priests to travel through the Holy Land.

"It will be my first and probably my last trip to the Holy Land," said Father Martin, explaining that priests only take the trip for their 25th anniversary - or for special studies.

There's no doubt about it though. His "family" thinks he deserves the thinks he deserves the vacation.





I apologize for my delay in answering your invitation to the Institute. I first had to learn my involvement in the Diocesan Synod which opens in October. Through October and November into the first week of December I am to lead the Speak-Up Sessions for the parish. I am already about four weeks behind in the organizational process. So I see no possibility of getting away this Fall.

I would have especially enjoyed this session of the Institute - particulary having Fr. David there. I will leave open my schedule to make the next session in the Spring. In view of this I would also like to suggest getting a replacement for me during the Institute. Frankly, Fr. Rupert would not be able to handle the parish by himself - the pressure will be a little too much, and it would lead to a series of kidney stones. Fr. Ralph wouldn't be able to give enough time - would be a help just when it comes to Masses (in speaking to me about going to this session he felt this could be about the most he could do, for he doesn't feel he should get into marriage cases, counseling, etc.)

I have taken another former priest on the parish staff. I am not bringing it up in the Chancery for awhile because I want this new parish program to get off the ground first. His name is Joseph Dillon and is a very close friend 66 Archbishop John Quinn, now of Oklahoma. I think I have found another real great person in this man - well qualified and very dedicated. I am enclosing some information on this new program. So far the response and cooperation from all the agencies and other churches in the area have been great. I have taken all the precautions necessary for such a venture (malpractice insurance, etc.) Right now we are forming a Board of Directors made up of principally professional people.

As far as other programs are concerned, we have been pretty successful. The Parish Food Commodity Program is serving over two thousand families a month now from our store downtown. 

One of the hispanic friars here said he talked with Jorge and he is talking about going back to his province in Columbia. He did ask me to stop the process of incorporation as one of his brothers was in a very bad auto accident and is paralyzed. He thought he might need to go back and help the family. Also he mentioned to this other friar something about the fact that the new Provincial is a friend of his and has been urging him to come back. So, I would not be surprised to see him move in that direction. In any case he has been after Fr. Damian Gamboa to come down and assist in the work with the hispanics. I know I discussed this with you the last time we were together and you agreed that there was a need. Damian has been very anxious to leave Tularosa and the situation was getting a bit tense there so I went ahead with the move, asking Peter Kreig to fill In until summer when we can find another pastor.

Damian will be leaving Tularosa in a few days and then will spend about a week at San Juan and should be down in San Luis Rey within the next two weeks. I have written a letter to Bishop Maher asking for an appointment as associate pastor with faculties. I believe that is appropriate.

I hope this is some help for the ministry there and we'll just have to see how it goes as it moves ahead. Please keep an eye on Damian, he does tend to over-extend himself and get rather rung out. I believe he complained he was getting an ulcer in Tularosa.

Marty, you have a tremendous amount of things going on there. I know it's a great burden and a lot of work so do take care of yourself.
