
First of all, I want to thank you for coming down to the Mount. It was very good speaking with you and I thought it was a fruitful meeting.

Last Wednesday, February 25, we had a faculty meeting. On the agenda was a discussion of Ed Dudzinski. Let me begin by saying that, as I told you, our faculty had some misgivings about Ed concerning his following of the directions we had given him. As I mentioned to you, he has become very involved in the College and over a period of time I've reminded him again and again to become more involved in the Seminary community. He seems to make some progress but doesn't seem to be totally involved in the community. I shared with the faculty the fact that you had some misgivings about him also and that we had mutually felt that his Ordination to Diaconate should be put off until some time after a good experience in a normal parish situation. The faculty agreed unanimously that this should be done. Therefore, sometime this week I'm going to see Ed and tell him that we have suggested that he not be ordained in the spring. I will tell him that we further will suggest that he be assigned to a normal parish situation this summer within the Diocese of Wilmington which will be unlike previous summers at beach parishes. After a full evaluation from the pastor or his supervisor in this parish concerning his ability to relate with the priests and adults in the parish and his ability to follow directions, then will we suggest that he be ordained to the Diaconate.
