

Brother Leo Labbe Appointed Superior At Notre Dame High

Brother Leo Labbe, SC, a member of the Notre Dame High School faculty since 1961, has been appointed superior of the Brothers of the Notre Dame High School faculty. Brother Louis Laperle, SC, will remain principal of the school.

The division of the authority of the principal and superior is in accordance with the recommendations of the Vatican Council and the resolutions of the Special Chapter of the New England Province of the Brothers of the Sacred Heart.

Brother Labbe, who has won local, state, and national renown in debating circles, will remain head of the English department and a member of the teaching staff.

New brothers on the faculty are Brother Bernard Lefebvre of Mount Saint Charles of Woonsocket, R.I., who holds a degree in chemistry from St. Michael's College, Winooski, Vt.; and Brother Mark Pierel of St. John's Hall, Woonsocket, R.I., who holds a degree in mathematics from Spring Hill College of Mobile, Ala.

Brother Eugene, SC, on the faculty since last January, has been re-assigned to St. Columbas College in England, which he founded in 1955.

The remaining faculty appointments are Brother Rene Tellier, SC, director of guidance; Brother George Gagnon, SC; Brother Alexis Raiche, SC; Brother Wilfred Pecteau, SC, maintenance; Brother Adrian Jutras, SC; Brother Edmond Patenaude, SC; Brother Roger Argencourt, SC; Brother Roger Lemoyne, SC; Brother Paul Barry, SC; Brother Allan Nadeau, SC; and Brother Larry Ferrari, SC. Laymen on the faculty are John O'Rourke, also athletic director; and Thomas Gentilella.

Another layman has been hired and another is being sought for the French and social studies or religion departments. Ten more students' new assignments will have four treatment of the environment of the record.

Brother Gagnon will reside at Cor Jesu Terrace in Passaic, R.I.
